**'Dream Of One Man'**

**Camp Columbus 25 Years Old**

Summer means a happy time for any youngster.

And, when a youngster can go to camp, this is doubly so, as well over 15,000 boys and girls have found out since July 13, 1933, when Camp Columbus on Owassco Lake was founded just

25 years ago this Sunday. THIS YEAR, as the camp celebrates its silver anniversary, boys and girls in and outside the Rochester Diocese, are currently enjoying the facilities of the camp, founded because of the dream of one man. He is Monsignor Frederick G. Straub, V.F., pastor of St. Alphonsus Church, Auburn.

As Mary Snyder pointed out last week, the founding of the camp on that date was due to an odd state of circumstances. The presentation of an annuity check, plus the advice of a bank friend plus the appearance of a lake front property owner on that particular day, resulted in the purchase of land on Owassco Lake.

WHEN THE camp was first founded, Monsignor Straub's intention was to have it for high

school lads, who, because of the depression, had little or nothing to do during the summer.

Prior to the advent of World War 2, the boys in high school found plenty of job opportunities during the summer, so the camp became a haven for pre-high school youngsters—the way it is set up today.

Actually, the camp has been moved since it was first founded. The first land Monsignor Straub purchased was on the west side of Owassco Lake. In 1936, construction on the present site—the east side of the lake—was started.

THE FIRST buildings to go up were a main building and three sleeping cabins, with two additional sleeping cabins being built in 1937. In 1937, the bathhouse was built and the chapel was constructed in 1940.

Since those early days, the size of the camp enrollment has increased from about 30 high school boys to 575 boy and girl campers last year.

Other outstanding features have also been added. A shrine to Our Lady was built in 1932, a dining hall in 1935 and the first permanent double cabin in 1937.

Of course, the camp has modern athletic facilities, including basketball and volley ball courts as well as two softball diamonds.

Realizing that sending their children to camp is a big sacrifice to many parents—especially those who have very large families—Monsignor Straub has kept the weekly rate to \$19 per youngster—a major financial triumph in these days of rising prices.

He is able to do this through the generous cooperation of many people.

For instance, just a few weeks ago, John Blagrove gave the Monsignor a check for \$18,500 to clear the camp mortgage. Every year, too, a minstrel show is put on at St. Alphonsus Church, which raises about \$3,500 towards the expenses of the camp.

THE CAMP is also given some help from the Federal Government and people in and outside the state also have been generous with their contributions.

The camp is located on a five and a half acre plot that has a beautiful lake front facilities—including a six foot wide, 170 foot long dock, with a 40 foot T-section.

Staffing the camp this year are 13 seminarians and two laymen. They are supervised by Father Robert G. Kreckel, who is in charge of the first three-week encampment, and Father Paul R. Schneck, who will be in charge of the second encampment.

Eleven of the counsellors are from St. Andrew's or St. Bernard's Seminaries. The other two seminarians are from St. Albert's Junior Seminary in Middletown, N.Y. Paul McCabe of St. Bernard's is head counsellor.

Girls will take over the last three-week encampment. They will be supervised by young ladies majoring in sociology in college. Father Gerald T. Connor is camp director during that period.

TO INSURE the campers safety on the water front, Monsignor Straub sent two of the seminarians, Robert Buckland and John Quinn, who will enter St. Bernard's in the Fall, to the American Red Cross Aquatic School at East Freetown, Mass., where they successfully completed the course as life saving instructors.

Camp Columbus is a member of the National Camping Association, connected with the National Catholic Welfare Conference, and is also affiliated with the American Camping Association.
