Mr. Merkel was retired nine years ago after being employed by the General Railway Signal Co. for 35 years, was a mechanical engineer and the inventor of the Merkel motorcycle and motor-bicycle. He was a native of Manistee, Mich.

Mt. Carmel High Admitted Into State University

Auburn—Mt. Carmel High School, Auburn, was admitted to the University of the State of New York as a four year high school as a result of action taken by the State Board of Regents at its last meeting.

Anthony E. Terino, chief of the bureau of secondary school supervision, notified the school of this decision in a letter to Rev. Brendan Hourihan, O. Carm., principal.

THE ADMISSION of the school comes as a result of a request for such admission made by the authorities at Mt. Carmel High School which concluded its first year as a four year high school in June of this year.

During the past school year supervisory visits by various members of the New York State Department of Education have been made at the school. This is customary procedure before the granting of permission for a school's admission into the State University.

Opened in 1955 as a two year high school with a freshman and sophomore class, the school came of age in September 1957 when for the first time four full years were taught. Father Brendan, principal since the beginning of the school, heads the staff of Carmelite Fathers who teach the boys enrolled at the school.

Members of the Sisters of St. Joseph teach the girls with Sister Stella Regina, S.S.J., as vice-principal.
