Air Line Switch Changes Dioceses

Perth, Australia — (NC) — Church jurisdiction over a coral atoll in the Indian Ocean has been transferred from one Australian diocese to another because of the re-routing of an air-line schedule.

The Apostolic Delegate, Archbishop Romulo Carboni, announced that the Cocos Islands, transferred to the Diocese of Darwin when civil authority over them was switched from Singapore to Australia in 1953, are now under the Archbishop of Perth. The change was made because Quantas Airways re-routed its Super Constellations through Perth to Cocos. The 25-island group lies about 1,850 miles north of Perth and 2,290 miles west of Darwin.

New Attendance Mark Set At Camp

The highest registration in the 33-year history of the Diocesan camp for boys and girls was set Sunday, July 13 when 140 campers signed in at Stella Maris.

On hand to greet them was the staff of 24 seminarians who act as counselors for the boys. Roger Switzer is head counselor assisted by Gerald Appleby. William Barrett is athletic director and Paul Freemesser is waterfront director. John Carey is director of the new craft lodge.

THE LODGE is located in the basement of the administration building and has already been put to good use as the intermission showers postponed ball games or outdoor activities. It was constructed by Joseph Morsch Jr., camp caretaker and Arthur Grant, camp carpenter and financed by the annual card party.

The most striking addition to camp this Summer is the new dock which measures over 100 feet in length and is parallel to and joined with the existing pier. **WITH OVER 400** feet of total

dock space, Stella Maris is one of the few camps in New York State to have such a complete, Red Cross approved swimming area. The new sections now provide a "crib" area for beginners which is 103 feet in length and 72 feet in width.

The beginners now enter and leave the waterfront on their own pier, are checked in at their own buddy board and have their own instructors and guards. The intermediate and advanced swimmers ("100 Yarders") enter and leave at the former main dock and have their own swimming areas and instructors on guard.

Campers average two swimming periods daily, one for instruction and one for recreation. Thanks to a donation of pens by St. Louis Church, Bluffton, the camp chapel in the woods can now seat 185 children and adults. New lights installed this Summer enhance the beauty and simplicity of the little white altar.

Daily Mass for the Sisters, seminarians and campers begins a day of well-supervised recreation for the boys and girls who go to Stella Maris.

Although the registration is at an all-time high, the 10 modern cabins accommodate the campers and their counselors without any crowding. Beginning their 12th year at camp, the Sisters of Mercy supervise the kitchen and dining room. At present Sister Virginia, R.N., is camp nurse and Dr. Richard Collins of Avon is camp physician.

The camp has two two-week and two one-week encampments for boys. Beginning Aug. 3, there will be a two-week and one-week encampment for girls. Rev. Eugene H. McFarland, Diocesan Youth Director, is director of the camp and resident chaplain.

Chaldean Patriarch Dies In Iraq

Vatican City — (RNS) — Word was received here from Baghdad, Iraq, of the death there of Patriarch Joseph Ghanima of Babylon of the Chaldees, spiritual leader of Catholics belonging to the Chaldean Eastern Rite.

Patriarch Ghanima, who was 77, had headed the patriarchate since 1947. His jurisdiction extended over Catholics believed to be descendants of ancient Babylonians. They are mostly found in Iraq, but have churches and communities also in such Middle East centers as Cairo, Beirut, Damascus and Aleppo.

THE PATRIARCH had served as a senator in the Iraqi parliament since 1951, having been appointed to the post by the former Regent of King Faisal II, Emir Abdul Ilah.

Born at Mossul, Iraq, Jan. 23, 1881, Patriarch Ghanima was ordained in 1904 and in 1925 was made Titular Bishop of Colibraso and Coadjutor to Patriarch Joseph Emmanuel Thomas. When the latter died in 1947 at the age of 65 after having been in office 27 years, Patriarch Ghanima was elected to succeed him.

Sovietology, New College Course

Montreal — (NC) — More than 65 Canadian government employees and students are taking a six-week course in Sovietology at the University of Montreal, the largest French Canadian and Catholic university in Canada. The course concludes in mid-August.

The course includes studies of Soviet foreign and domestic policy, Marxism and Leninism, the Russian language and its translation.

Russian daily newspapers, such as Pravda and Isvestia, and weekly and monthly publications from the Leningrad Academy of Science are being flown here.
