# Air Line Switch Changes Dioceses

Perth, Australia — (NC) — Church jurisdiction over a coral atoll in the Indian Ocean has been transferred from one Australian diocese to another because of the rerouting of an air-line schedule.

The Apostolic Delegate, Archbishop Romolo Caponzi, announced that the Cocos Islands, transferred to the Diocese of Darwin when civil authority over them was switched from Singapore to Australia in 1935, are now under the Archbishop of Perth. The change was made because Quantas Airways rerouted its Super Constellations through Perth to Cocos. The 25-island group lies about 1,850 miles north of Perth and 2,290 miles west of Darwin.

Montreal — (NC) — More than 65 Canadian government employees and students are taking a six-week course in Sovietology at the University of Montreal, the largest French Canadian and Catholic university in Canada. The course concludes in mid-August.

The course includes studies of Soviet foreign and domestic policy, Marxism and Leninism, the Russian language and its translation.

Russian daily newspapers, such as Pravda and Izvestia, and weekly and monthly publications from the Leningrad Academy of Science are being flown here.
