

## Sacred Heart Enthroned At Camp Villa Maria

Rev. Francis Larkin, S.S.C.C., national director of the Enthronement of the Sacred Heart, outlined a story of Jesus as an infant, a boy and a young man camping during the flight into Egypt on the annual trips for enrollment in Jerusalem and at other times during His life on earth in a magazine article on the enthronement.

"We can think of Jesus as the first camper, as there was no room in the inn for St. Joseph and our Blessed Mother on that first Christmas eve. And so, we may say that Joseph and Mary camped out in the lowly stable and that the Baby Jesus was the first camper."

FATHER LARKIN suggests this as a means of preparing the campers and staff for the ceremony of the enthronement, permitted in Catholic camps for the first time this year. This article, and the ritual for the ceremony, appeared in the March-April issue of Trail Signs, a magazine primarily intended for Catholic Camps.

On July 9, following the annual dinner for members of their executive board, the ceremony was conducted by Rev. Bartholomew J. O'Brien, of St. Peter and Paul's Church, Elmira, at Camp Villa Maria, on Harris Hill.

Under a natural canopy of oak trees against a background of sheltering pines, the campers had erected a rustic shrine. Led by the counselors, bearing lighted tapers, 110 campers marched in pairs from their cabins to the extreme end of the camp grounds, humming the hymn "Hail Holy Queen." Then came the board members and friends, preceding Msgr. Arthur E. Rallgan, Rev. Donald Mulcahy and Father O'Brien.

THE FULL RITUAL, written especially for camps, was followed by the entire assembly reciting the prayers or answering the ejaculatory phrases. Father O'Brien's talk was directed to his youthful listeners but the staff and all others found his story of the Boy Jesus, sadly searching for a camp which had not been given to Him, a startling challenge to an increased and intensified devotion to the Sacred Heart.

Constance Frank, camp director, enthroned the statue and received the certificate from Father O'Brien. The services closed with the singing of Holy God and a procession back to the cabins and big hall. Special devotions to the Sacred Heart, daily.
