**Rome Eternal**  
Film Series  
On WROC-TV

New York — The first filming of St. Peter's tomb, deep under St. Peter's Basilica, will be shown on the "Rome Eternal" repeat telecast on the NBC-TV Network, Aug. 3, from 5 to 5:30 p.m.

The series will be telecast in Rochester by WROC-TV, Channel 5. "Rome Eternal" a four-part film series on The Catholic Hour, Aug. 3, 10, 17 and 24, will present again, by popular demand, a documentary portrait of Rome and Vatican City, past and present.

"The City of Peter," the Aug. 3rd show, will reconstruct the life of rich, pagan Rome, then trace the transition from paganism to Christianity. Among the historic scenes in the first show are the Apian Way, the great aqueducts, the Forum, the Colosseum, Trevi fountain, the Catacombs, pagan and Christian art, and the beauty of St. Peter's.

**8,000 See First 'Festival Of Psalms'**

London — (NC) — People come from many parts of Britain and from abroad to attend a "Festival of Psalms" produced by Catholics here. Over 8,000 people gathered at the Royal Albert Hall here for both afternoon and evening performances, which were believed to be the first of their kind in the world. The psalms, in English, set to the melodies of Father Joseph Gelineau, a French Jesuit, were sung and acted by choirs and ballet groups.

Outstanding feature of the program was an exhibition of psalm dancing by 22 deaf-mute girls from the deaf institute of St. Michaelsgestel, Dombosh, Holland.

**Condemned Film**  
**Court Dismisses Censorship Case**

Providence, R. I. — (RNS) — In a split decision, the U.S. District Court here dismissed on technical grounds a constitutional challenge of Providence's film censorship procedures.

The American distributor of the French film, "And God Created Woman," contended that refusal of the Providence Bureau of Licenses to license the film violated the separation of Church and State.

Kinsley International Pictures Corp. of New York said this refusal violated such separation in accepting motion picture ratings made by a religious organization, the Legion of Decency.

THE AMERICAN distributor also contended that refusal to license the film violated the federal Constitution by abridging freedom of speech.

While the court decision decried an injunction against city censors, it did not rule on the issue of whether the city's censorship procedures were unconstitutional or whether the film is obscene.

The court opinion ruled that "there has never been an application made for a license" in Providence.

**Survey Reveals**  
**Most U.S. Priests 'Average Guys'**

Notre Dame — (RNS) — The majority of America's future Catholic priests are "average guys." They come from middle-class families, graduate from a hometown high school before entering a seminary and have at least one relative in religious life, a leading Jesuit sociologist declared here.

These findings were disclosed by the Rev. Joseph H. Fichter, S.J., visiting professor of sociology at Notre Dame University, in an address on "Sources of Priestly Vocations" at the 11th Vocation Institute. The institute was sponsored by Notre Dame.

FATHER FICHTER based his conclusions on four separate surveys of young men attending major Catholic seminaries. Two of the studies were completed recently under his supervision.

The Jesuit disclosed that 60 per cent of the seminarians are sons of middle-class and upper-middle-class parents who have white-collar jobs or are in the managerial or professional fields. Only one out of ten come from families with below average income, he said.

Disputing the notion that priestly vocations flourish in large Catholic families, Father Fichter said that about half of the vocations come from families with four children or fewer.

"The smaller families," he said, "contribute more than a third of their children to the service of God, while the larger families contribute only about a fifth."

Vocations do "run in families," the Jesuit scholar observed, since two-thirds of the seminarians surveyed have one or more relatives in the religious life. He attributed this not so much to the personal example of the older persons, however, but to "an attitude or frame of mind toward the concept of vocation among members of a family which already has received a vocation."

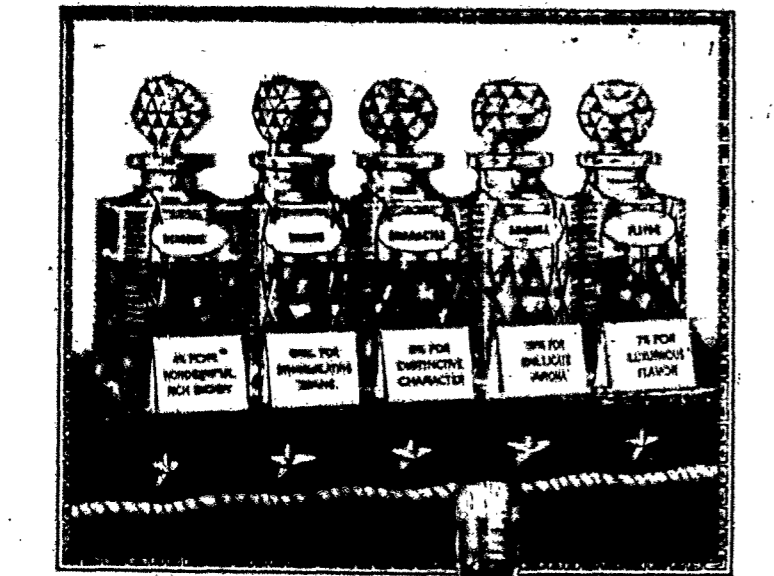
Father Fichter who heads the sociology department at Loyola University of the South, New Orleans, La., also pointed out that vocations "run in parishes."

"There exist parishes in this country," he said, "some of them established for more than 50 years, out of which not a single priestly vocation has come."

In this country, the priest said, Catholic and public high schools produce twice as many priests as do minor seminaries. "It appears to be a question of major moment when we discover that the minor seminaries on the high school level are producing fewer priests than the Catholic and public high schools of America," he stressed.

Father Fichter concluded that the sources of priestly vocations
