Maryknoll is comprised of two distinct organizations, one for priests and brothers, and the other for the Maryknoll Sisters now in session.

First act of the chapter of 30 Sisters representing 1,300 in the community was to elect Mother Mary Colman of Wilkes Barre, Pa. as Mother General for the ensuing term.

Sister Miriam David the delegate from Hawaii has had 21

years of varied mission experience. The Maryknoll Sisters began work in Hawaii in 1927. They have six large schools on the islands of Oahu and Maui. They are also responsible for the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine work in the Islands and staff the Social Service Bureau of the Honolulu diocese.

The nun from Hawaii has a sister, Sister Miriam Anthony in the Maryknoll community. The nun is a novice mistress at the Maryknoll Sisters' Novitiate in Valley Park, Mo. The two nuns' mother, Mrs. Thomas L. Donovan and brothers, Leonard T. and Harry J. Donovan reside at 15 1/2 Park St., Auburn. Another brother, Joseph, resides at 7 Adams St., Auburn and a sister, Mrs. Richard Cain, 2935 S. Salina St., Syracuse.

Basilica Memorial Rites To Honor 'Father Baker'

Memorial services marking the 22 anniversary of the death of Monsignor Nelson H. Baker, founder and builder of the world renowned Our Basilica, Lackawanna, N.Y., will be held on Tuesday, July 29. The traditional Solemn Requiem Mass will begin at 10 o'clock and will be followed by a procession to Father Baker's grave.

IN EXTENDING an invitation to attend to friends in the Diocese of Rochester, Monsignor Joseph M. McPherson, superintendent of Our Lady of Victory Homes, pointed out that open house will be observed during the balance of the day.

Guides will be on duty to escort visitors through the Homes and the beautiful basilica, erected by Father Baker as a lasting act of thanksgiving to Our Blessed Lady.

Born in 1841, Father Baker's vocation to the priesthood came rather late in life. He was ordained at the age of 35 and died July 29, 1936 at the age of 95.

All but a few months of his sixty priestly years were spent with his babies and boys at Our Lady of Victory. A pioneer of the Catholic Press, he founded the Victorian Magazine, a Catholic Monthly, now in its 64th year of publication.
