

Basilica Memorial Rites To Honor 'Father Baker'

Memorial services marking the 22 anniversary of the death of Monsignor Nelson H. Baker, founder and builder of the world renowned Our Lady of Victory Homes and Basilica, Lackawanna, N.Y., will be held on Tuesday, July 23. The traditional Requiem Mass will begin at 10 o'clock and will be followed by a procession to Father Baker's grave.

IN EXTENDING an invitation to attend to friends in the Diocese of Rochester, Monsignor Joseph M. McPherson, superintendent of Our Lady of Victory

Homes, pointed out that one house will be observed during the balance of the day.

Guides will be on duty to escort visitors through the Home and the beautiful basilica, erected by Father Baker as a lasting act of thanksgiving to Our Blessed Lady.

Born in 1841, Father Baker's vocation to the priesthood came rather late in life. He was ordained at the age of 35 and died July 29, 1936 at the age of 95.

All but a few months of his sixty priestly years were spent with his babies and boys at Our Lady of Victory. A pioneer of the Catholic Press, he founded the Victorian Magazine, a Catholic Monthly, now in its 64th year of publication.

Arts Building Begun At St. Bonaventure

St. Bonaventure, N. Y. — A \$5,000,000 building and development program was initiated at St. Bonaventure University when construction of a new Liberal Arts building was started this week.

The three-story brick building is being built by the Stegfeld Construction Company, Inc., of Buffalo. The firm was awarded the contract by the University's Board of Trustees.

Laying and blessing of the cornerstone is scheduled for October 7 at rededication ceremonies of the University, currently marking its centennial in a year-long observance.

Besides the Arts building, a new 300-room dormitory is to be included in the program. Completion of the dormitory will release rooms in Devereux Hall for an additional 200 boarding students.

Newly Constructed Church To Open In Diocese, Sunday

Six Masses are scheduled for the opening of the new St. Thomas More Church, 2513 East Ave., Brighton on July 27 according to the Rev. Francis Pagnam, pastor.

Formal dedication of the new edifice on the former Duescher estate will take place in the Fall. Father Pagnam said. He listed the Sunday Masses beginning at 7, 8, 9, 10, 11 a.m. and 12 noon.

The new edifice of modern design but showing strong Tudor influence is about 85 per cent completed. Minor details will be handled as the church is in use on Sundays. Opening will climax several years of planning and construction.

THE PARISH formed in 1953 has served up to now in the chapel and auditorium of St. John Fisher College on Fairport Road. Approximately 500 families are in the parish and Father

Pagnam is assisted by the Rev. Daniel R. Brunt.

One of the largest structures to be built in the Diocese of Rochester in recent years, the new church was designed by Conway L. Todd. It sits well back from East Ave. on the 13-acre Drescher property. Seating capacity is about 700.

Discipline features are the sharply sloping roof, which rises more than 50 feet above the ground, huge Tudor-style windows along the sides of the church and a large carved crucifix above the main altar.

HIGH OVER the main door is a carved representation of the coat of arms of St. Thomas More. This was executed by William Ehrlich, sculptor at the Memorial Art Gallery and the University of Rochester.

Attached to the church structure is the St. Thomas More Church School in charge of the Sisters of St. Joseph. Ample parking space is available.
