Romanian Bishop Said Arrested

Belgrade — (RNS) — Bishop Aaron Marton of Alba Julia in Communist Romania has been deprived of freedom of movement by the Bucharest government, according to Blagovesni, the only Catholic magazine published in this country.

The publication said the action against Bishop Marton has greatly restricted his activities and amounts to virtual house arrest. It said he is permitted to offer Mass in the Bucharest Cathedral and in the chapel of his residence, "but everything else is forbidden to him."

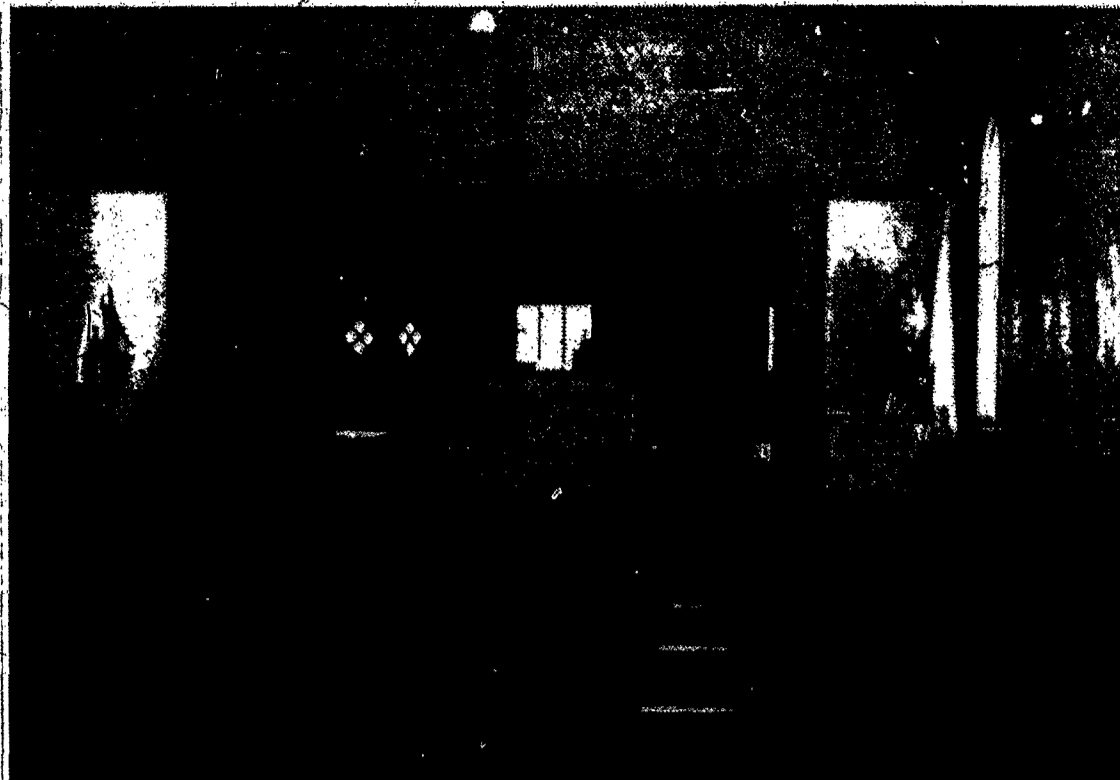
The only priest serving both parishes both Summer and Winter, Father Harding is kept busy in the Gotham Central and Mid-West Central Schools.

Lebanon's New President

Beirut — (NC) — Lebanon's President-elect, Gen. Fuad Chehab, is a Maronite Rite Catholic known for his attachment to his alma-mater—the Marist Brothers' school at Juneh— and as the benefactor of social and educational projects.

But above all else he is now looked to as the man who may bring an end to this country's civil war and facilitate withdrawal of U.S. Marines.

In Washington Secretary of State John Foster Dulles said that the U.S. would remove the troops landed in Lebanon last month if asked to withdraw by Lebanon's new government.

In electing Gen. Chehab the Parliament of this half-Christian, half-Moslem nation adhered to the tradition that the president must be a Maronite Catholic.

This tradition has its basis in the fact that Maronite Rite Catholics form the largest single religious group in the country. According to the same unwritten law, the Prime Minister is always a Sunni Moslem. The constitution provides that representation in Parliament is decided on a religious basis, not one of political parties.

The government and opposition forces joined in backing the President-elect, who has the confidence of both Catholics and Moslems. Maronite Rite Patriarch Paul Jeonchi of Antioch, particularly praised the General as the only man who can restore peace and security to strife-torn Lebanon.

General Chehab was born in 1903 at Ghazir, in the heart of the Maronite community in central Lebanon. His, it is re-

ported, is an ancient Moslem Maronite family that became Maronite. As a member of a family that ruled a part of the country from 1660 to 1842, the President-elect has right to the title of Emir (Prince), although he does not use it. Since that time, his family has held judicial, military and administrative posts.

The President-elect was educated by the Marist Brothers at their famous Juneh college. The present enrollment of this institution is 1,650 students. The present Moslem Prime Minister, Sami Solh, is also a graduate of this college. He refused to vote in the election.

GEN. CHEHAB is devoted to the Marist college. When he was constructing his new home, he built it alongside the college in Juneh.

The president-elect's military career has been signaled by its firm neutral character through several different French, Palestinian and Lebanese crises. He was the choice for the Provisionary Presidency in 1952, and he resigned the post of Defense Minister in the Chamoun cabinet to preserve his neutrality.

His wife is the former Rose Moret, daughter of a French official. They have no children.

At the age of 19 he went to the French military school at Damascus and later was graduated from St. Cyr, the French West Point.

He is known as a sincere, practicing Catholic.

They will be met by the Branch of the Hospitale de Notre Dame de Lourdes and conveyed to the Hospital of the Seven Dolours where reservations have been made for them.

Facilities have been arranged for their participation in the various pilgrimage exercises, including the blessing of the sick, the prayers at the grotto and the immersion in the Baths. Medical and nursing care will be provided for them on route and in Lourdes a chaplain will assist the pilgrims in their spiritual needs throughout. The flight is open

Ancient Balkan Church Discovered In Forest

Belgrade — (RNS) — Ruins of what experts say may be the oldest Christian church in the Balkans have been found near Lake Ohrid in Macedonia, close to the Albanian frontier.

Apparently those of a three-aisled church, the ruins were partly underground and were discovered accidentally by forest

workers. Archaeologists have uncovered the floor, strewn with priceless mosaics in eleven colors, a baptistry and traces of a nearby cemetery.
