## New Gift Shop At Hospital

Something new has opened at St. Mary's Hospital, Rochester. A greatly enlarged gift shop located just off the main lobby at the Genesee St. hospital, which has enabled the shop to greatly expand its facilities and variety of articles carried.

KNOWN as the Marillac Gift Shop, it was founded in February, 1950 by Mrs. Rudolf C. Siebert during her four year term of office as chairman of the women's board of the hospital.

Upon her resignation in 1957, Mrs. Joseph S. Weber became chairman and served for one year. The shop was named after the Countess Louise de Marillac, the founder of the Daughters of Charity of St. Vincent de Paul in France, the order to which the Sisters of Charity who maintain St. Mary's Hospital, belong.

DURING RECENT alterations in the hospital after the coming of Sister Teresa, new administrator of St. Mary's, the location of the shop was changed.

Larger quarters were provided, so Mrs. Frederick G. McSer, present chairman of the women's board, re-organized and planned to increase the services the shop could render to patients, the public and the hospital personnel.

She has appointed a committee of board members headed by Mrs. John Gleason, chairman, Mrs. Gordon A. Reitz, Mrs. Frank P. Feerick, and Mrs. Paul Neubert who will have charge of all shop activities.

"So vacation went haywire?" we asked. (We had seen the take-off with the endless amount of work to provide food, bedding, clothing for the family-of-six as Johnny and Lu prepared to enjoy a week's vacation at a beach cottage with another young couple and their children.)

"Well," there was a slight quaver in Lu's voice, "The first day was fun — and then somebody — one of their kids or one of ours — stopped up the plumbing. We were too far away from civilization to get it fixed right away, so we just had to come home. Oh, well," Lu smiled. "Someday we'll laugh over it — I guess — and anyway, we have this picnic, and I can catch up on housecleaning."

HARKING BACK to the days when we had many small children, we could envision the amount of work that had gone into even this, the "casual" picnic — not only the food preparation, but the clean up of the little house, the usual daily wash — and putting away of yesterday's wash — the aforementioned tubbing and scrubbing, the inevitable pick-ups, such as when Maura made scrambled eggs on the kitchen floor, the refereeing of squabbles, the answering of a countless number of phone calls —

"N'ever an idle waking moment" came back to mind from that Mary Haworth column.

Gathering together the remnants from the picnic that had been such a morale-boosting to her immobilized sister-in-law, Lu washed sticky faces and hands and prepared to drive the quartette back home for naps. Then, of course, there would be dinner to get more baths and beddizing down of youngsters before entertaining friends for the evening.
