Mid-Summer Gladness Urged By Realtors

With summer well begun, Rochester area families are urged to "Buy a Home—First" and take advantage of many weeks of healthful and pleasant outdoor gardening and entertaining in the grounds of their own residences by William C. Kane, president of the Real Estate Board of Rochester.

"You might call it 'Mid-Summer Gladness,'" the realtor suggested.

He made the statement in connection with the "Buy a Home—First" campaign currently being conducted by local Realtors in cooperation with other members of the National Association of Real Estate Boards throughout the nation. He added that this is an excellent time to acquire a home since financing terms are more liberal than for many months and surveys indicate that prices of homes in the majority of areas will remain

constant during the remainder of the year.

"When most people think of a home, they think of hearth fires and snug comfort," Mr. Kane continued. "That's true, of course, in the cold weather months. But modern America has discovered new charm in the outdoor activities associated with home in the summer season.

"There is a new vogue in America today as a visit to any hardware store will show. Outdoor entertainment has come into its own as shown by the scores of charcoal broilers and new and inviting lines of lawn furniture. And the growth of plant nursery sales and garden clubs speaks volumes for the satisfaction of home gardeners."

Kane contended that if there ever was a time in our national history when home was a "place to hang your hat," that era was sometime back.

"The truth of the matter is," he said, "as a considerable body of current fiction and non-fiction shows, that the home has become more than ever before the center of interest for the families of the nation. The entertainment of friends and guests at home has taken on new popularity, and in summertime the backyard or patio has displaced commercial entertainment centers to a considerable degree. Even Dad has fallen in step with the new trend as a number of outdoor male chefs testify."
