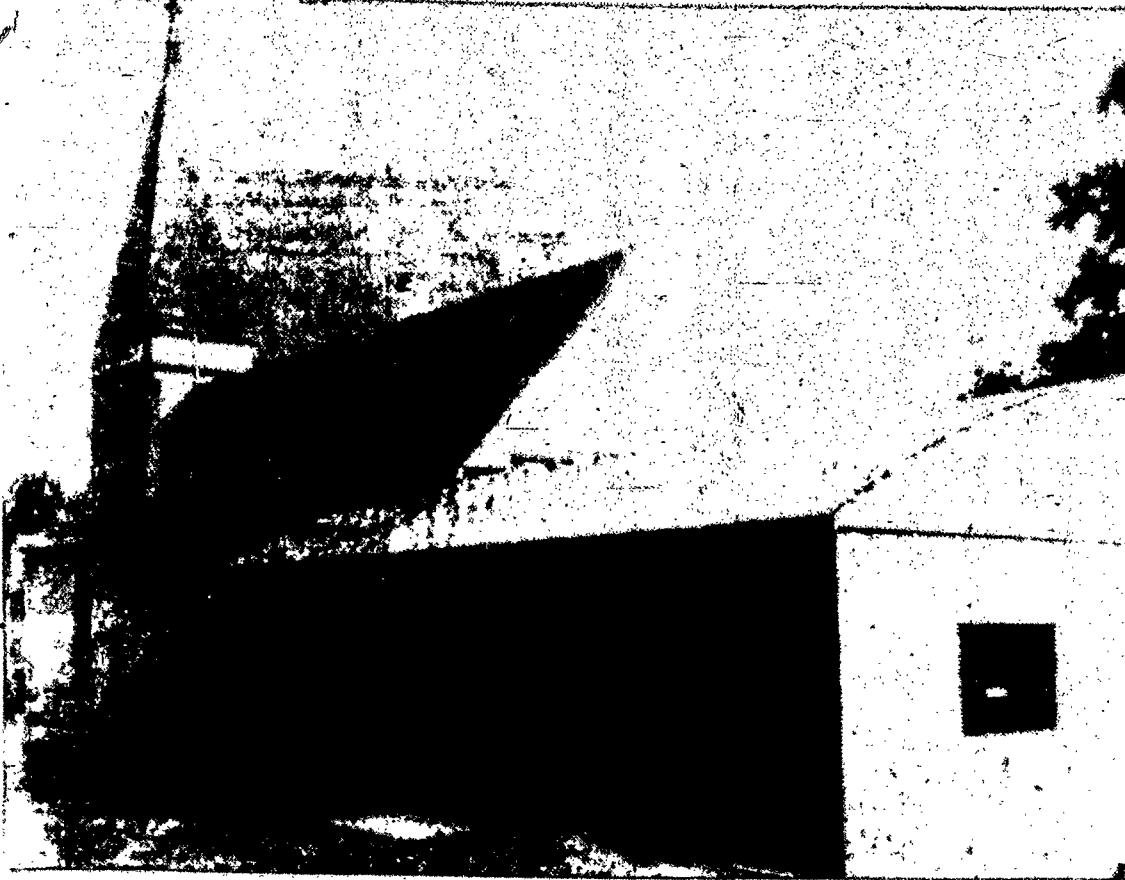

Cooperation Key To Success

In the recent Broadway musical show, "Plain and Fancy," there was a number called "How Do You Raise a Barn?", which showed the spirit of cooperation among Amish people in Pennsylvania.

Their religion is different, but the people of St. Theresa's Parish, Stanley, and St. Mary's Parish, Rushville, have been showing since 1949 that people in New York also work together.

This applies to all things, but especially to the annual picnic held last Saturday on the church grounds at Stanley.

MEMBERS of both parishes, headed by committees from the

Altar and Rosary and Holy Name Societies, pitched in to help make this annual festival a financial and social success.

While the women did the cooking and salad making for the ham and chicken dinner, the men constructed booths for the fair which always accompanies the annual festival.

Father Francis Harding, pastor of St. Theresa's and the mission church, St. Mary's in Rushville, stated that this enthusiastic cooperation of members of both parishes, is reflected in everything that the people of this area do.

"Since my arrival here in 1954," Father Harding said, "the people of both parishes have been very cooperative in

every project that I have undertaken.

"Just this past Spring, the people in Rushville volunteered their time to help build an addition on St. Mary's Church. This was done under the supervision of a professional contractor.

"The people realized that this addition was needed because of the increase in the Summer population. We are quite close to Lake Canandaigua," he related.

"When I asked for the money last Summer, I planned only to buy the property in the rear of the church," Father said. "But the parishioners and vacationers at Rushville gave \$8,000 in answer to my plea and I was able to buy both the property and build the addition."

FATHER HARDING said that Mass attendance during the Summer in Rushville is four times as large as Winter attendance.
