There are about 75 Catholics attending Mass in Rushville during the summer. We have 200 since St. Mary's Church holds only 100 people the addition which can also seat 100 was recently installed.

Father Harding said that the Catholic population in Stanley and the vicinity were railroad people who were brought here when the Lehigh Valley, Pennsylvania and Short Line Railroads were in their heyday.

"Now most of the people in Stanley are farmers," he said. "The rest of the people in the area work in the nearby cities of Geneva and Canandaigua, since there is no industry in their cooperative spirit. They transport the children to the

long-time classes since they and St. Mary's was built in the 1890s after a fire destroyed the parish. When financially able to do so, Father Harding hopes to put a heating system in the new addition at Rushville, which will then be used as a parish center.

Since his arrival at Stanley Father Harding has been able to accomplish many things. In addition to the Rushville addition, "Among these were the refurbishing of the rectory and a new heating plant and new floor for St. Theresa's. One of his parishioners, Mrs. Elizabeth Dallor presented the church a \$1,500 organ for St. Theresa's.

The church in Stanley, which is debt-free was built in 1875 any of the three towns the parishes serve.

The only priest serving both parishes both Summer and Winter, Father Harding is kept busy in the Gorham Central and Middlesex Central Schools.
