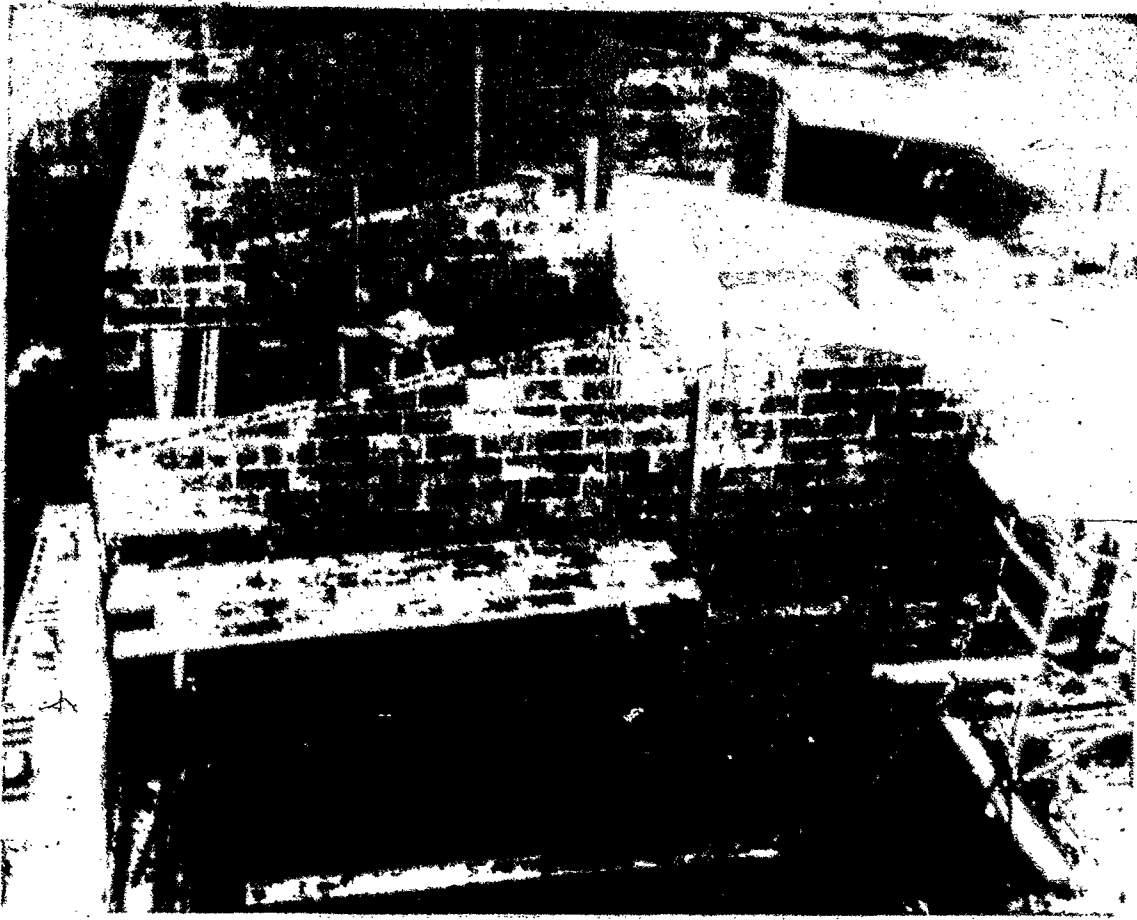


## New Buildings

ST. AUGUSTINE'S school addition, Chili Avenue.



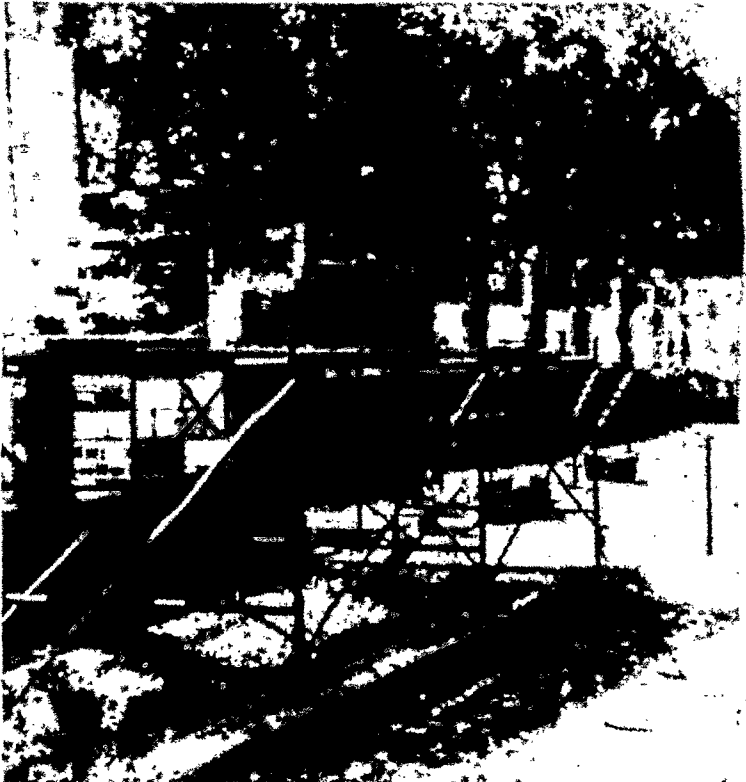
HOLY ANGELS convent and girls' home nears completion on Winton Road, Irondequoit.



MOTHER OF SORROWS new convent for expanding Greece parish.



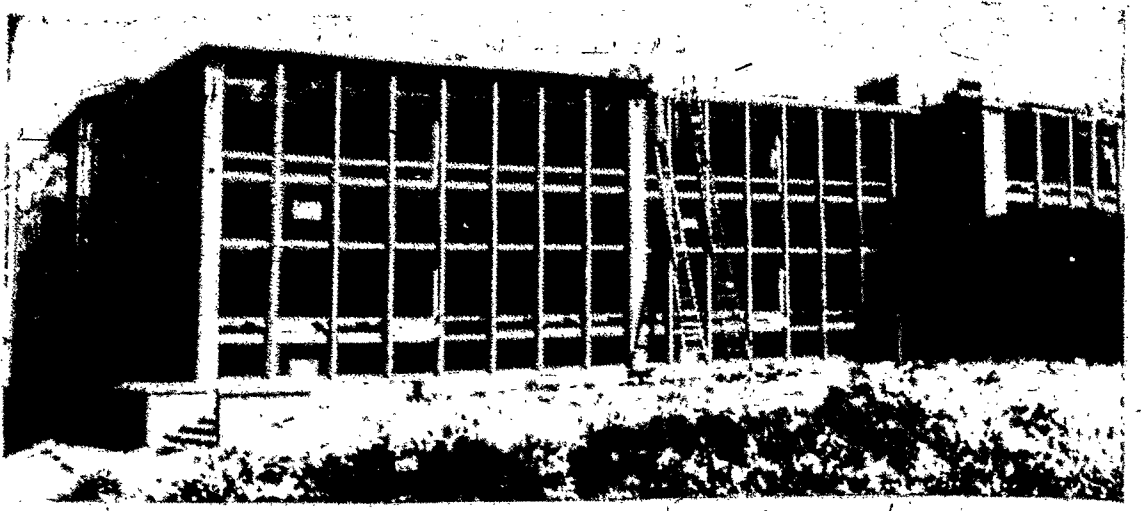

## Man-Made Kidney Installed

(Continued from Page 1) In the machine which acts as a blood bath to remove the poison from the blood.

Surrounding the blood bath is a huge container that holds the solution which makes the blood function normally as it would be in the body. This solution contains among other things, sodium chloride, and sodium bicarbonate.

In the most serious cases, a six hour period is needed to remove the poison in the body. During this time, the solution surrounding the blood bath is changed three times — every two hours, Doctor Talamas said.

A person undergoing this treatment is normally conscious during the whole time and lays on his bed next to the machine.

The blood is fed into the machine through transparent tubing that taps the blood in the patient's vein or artery. It then passes through the blood bath, which passes the poison through the tiny pores in the semi-permeable membrane, but which does not remove the necessary bacteria from the blood and then sends the blood of the patient back through the same type of transparent tubing into another vein or artery in the body.

"The transparent tubing and the cellulose material can only

be used once and costs \$67.30 to be replaced," Doctor Talamas said. "In addition, when the kidney is used successfully, the patient has been completely cured," he added.

Each whole blood — two and one-half pints — is put into the blood bath before the patient is used as yet at St. Mary's, but a vein is tapped and there is also similar type machine was used extensively at Georgetown University Hospital during the past of an emergency during the years, Dr. Talamas said.

THE MACHINE pumps an average of 500 cubic centimeters of blood through the machine every minute and oxygen tanks, containing 90 percent pure oxygen and 10 percent carbon dioxide are also used in the process to make sure that the artificial kidney functions as well as the human kidney.

Dr. Talamas arrived in this country in 1954, coming to St. Mary's for the first time in that team of three is necessary for any case, two doctors and a nurse. He also said that since the artificial kidney has been in use, it has saved many cases that prior to its invention, would be hopeless.

"Where in previous very serious cases of uremia poisoning, 50 percent of all patients would die, the artificial kidney has been able to cut the death rate to 35 percent," Doctor Talamas related to St. Mary's this summer.

## Faith Spans Iron Curtain

Berlin — (NC) — Nearly all members of the German hierarchy, including two cardinals, and several foreign bishops attended the opening of the national convention of German Catholics here.

With thousands of visitors from the Soviet zone present at the inauguration of the

"Katholikentag" (Catholic Congress), the gathering promised to become a manifestation of the bond of Faith uniting Catholics in East and West Germany across all artificial political boundaries.

Red rulers of East Germany raised no objections to the meetings of the convention being held

simultaneously in the Soviet district of the former German capital and the western sectors.

THEY ALSO approved of four special trains crossing their territory from the Federal Republic.

Fourteen trains had originally been applied for, but organizers of the convention expressed satisfaction that at least a limited contingent of visitors from West were granted access to the Soviet zone.

An impressive ceremony of the five-day meeting was the opening Pontifical Mass sung by Austrian Archbishop Franziskus Koenig of Vienna in the open square in front of St. Hedwig's cathedral, which is still being remodeled after suffering severe damage during World War II.

Thousands of women gathered there, across the street from Communist party headquarters, to pray for the peace of the world.

## 'Heart Surrender' Bid Lures China Protestants

Hong Kong — (RNS) — Chinese Communist authorities have launched a "heart-surrendering" movement among Protestants in Anhwei province aimed at forcing them to yield completely to Red leadership and control, according to an official report from that area.

THE REPORT said 185 Protestant clergymen recently held a forum in the province at which a resolution was adopted pledging them to "unfold an anti-imperialistic patriotic movement to eliminate the poison of imperialistic ideas in the Protestant Church in China and crush imperialists in its ranks."

According to the report, several "rightists" Protestant cler-

gymen were exposed and condemned at the meeting. It identified them as Hu-Chun-jen, pastor of the Methodist church in Wuhu; Lu Chao-yang, a preacher of the China Inland Mission in Linchuan county; Lin Ping-chen, a preacher of the Methodist church in Tengchi; Wang Kuang-pu, a preacher at the Anglican church in Tengchi; Pan Pei-en, pastor of the China Inland Mission in Fuyang; and Chai Chien-chang, pastor of the Presbyterian Church in Pengpu.

## Wife, Children Attend New Priest's First Mass

Toronto — (RNS) — His wife and three children were among scores of faithful who received the blessing of a newly-ordained Eastern Rite priest when he sang his first solemn Mass in Holy Eucharist Catholic church here.

Father Anthony Zouzal was one of three residents of Canada who were ordained in Munich, Germany, for the Ukrainian Rite by Archbishop John Bucko, Apostolic Visitor to Catholics of that Rite living in Western Europe.

MANY EASTERN Rite married men in Europe become priests and Father Zouzal sought and obtained permission from the Vatican to go back to Europe for his ordination. No bishop in North America can ordain a married man to the priesthood.
