

Ohio Mailmen Asks Laws To Restrict Obscenity

Columbus — (NC) — Delegates to the Ohio Rural Letter Carriers Association convention here urged strict legislation to prevent the sending of obscene matter through the mails.

In a resolution presented during the general session of the four-day meeting, the representatives of more than 1,400 Ohio

letter carriers went on record to: "Urge the Congress of the United States to enact legislation which will prohibit the distribution of such matter through the U.S. mails and which will penalize violators of this prohibition with fine, imprisonment or both."

W. C. Ambrüst, representing U.S. Postmaster General Arthur E. Suranfield at the meeting, told the delegates that the present law is inadequate and the department wants new legislation with teeth in it.

Mortgages held by the three savings banks amounted to \$282,928,073, which is an increase of \$6,461,903 since the year end, the presidents reported.

Prelate Deplores Migrants' Homes

Walla Walla, Wash. — (NC) — After a visit to the labor camps of seasonal Mexican farm workers near here, Bishop Bernard J. Topel of Spokane deplored living conditions of the laborers and their families.

In his column in the Inland Register, diocese's newspaper, Bishop Topel said he was dismayed to see as many as 12 persons in a single family living in one-room units.

"I said the general impression of the camps brought to mind accounts of primitive living conditions slaves endured in the South 100 years ago.

"There are perhaps 80 units for Mexicans to live in," the Bishop said. "Only seven, I am told, have running water in them. Water, toilet, and bath facilities are in a separate building. This services the entire Mexican camp, except for the few that have their own."

When he visited the families, he said, many were preparing dinner on wood cook stoves, with the temperature outside just short of 100 degrees.

"THE TEMPERATURE inside

was, of course, definitely greater," he said. "I saw babies trying to sleep in that temperature."

"The Bishop said the laborers' poor living conditions stresses their need for labor unions.

"As I walked around the camp," he asserted, "these two thoughts came to mind: first, how is it possible that in such a prosperous community as Walla Walla, people brought in to work are treated so badly; secondly, when I saw how bad these conditions are, I realized anew the necessity of unions."

During his visit to Walla Walla, Bishop Topel offered Mass for Mexican families in the chapel of St. Mary's Hospital. He confirmed 18 Mexicans.

Twenty-seven Mexican children have received their first Holy Communion during their stay here.

Old Monastery Victim Of 'Progress'

Belgrade — (RNS) — A medieval monastery will be submerged under water to form an artificial lake for a hydro-electric power station in Bosnia, west central Yugoslavia.

The monastery of St. John, built in the 16th century, stands in the Neretva river valley near Mostar.

Several beautiful frescoes of an invaluable price, dating from the 17th century, will be removed from the walls and taken to a government museum. Photographs and descriptions will be made of the others which will be submerged with the monastery.
