Drive Slated For Scout Work

A threefold increase in Boy and Girl Scouting in Rochester and Monroe County since the war has created an urgent need for expansion and improvement of camping and service facilities which will be financed through a \$1,497,000 United Scouting Development Fund campaign this fall.

Howard T. Cumming, general campaign chairman, in announcing the campaign, said: "Today, out of our county population of 103,286 boys and girls of Scouting age, 28.5 percent, or 29,510 are enrolled. In 1945, the combined Boy and Girl Scout registration was 10,616, or 16.8 percent of the 774 boys and girls of Scout age."

The plan is the first of many activities planned by the organization for the coming school year. The Rochester Club, made up of students from the Rochester area, has been an active organization on the St. Bonaventure campus for some time. INVITATIONS were sent to all the club members as well as the incoming Freshmen. The picnic will give the entering Freshmen an opportunity to meet their fellow classmates from Rochester.

"Terrible Mistake To Be Repaired" Sania Fy—(RNS)—One of New Mexico's most beautiful and historic mission churches, destroyed by a "terrible mistake" in 1904, will be restored near here by the Indians of San Ildefonso Pueblo. The Indians, who are Catholics, now attend services in a temporary church. San Ildefonso mission was built in 1711 by Franciscan missionaries and used by the Indians as their parish church until 1904. In that year a move was initiated to demolish the old structure and build a new one. Prominent members of the pueblo resisted the move but, while many of them were away attending the World's Fair in St. Louis, the group favoring a new church tore down the old building.
