

# Nazareth Dorm Ready In January

Further expansion in residence facilities at Nazareth College has been necessary to accommodate the increased number of out-of-town students seeking admission to the Rochester Catholic women's college.

The new dormitory for which the cornerstone was laid by Bishop Kearney after the commencement exercises on June 2, will be ready for occupancy the second semester.

In the meantime, freshmen will again occupy temporary living quarters in the old library in the administration building and a group of juniors will live in the rear wing of the second floor of the administration building, where dormitories have been set up.

THE NEW Lourdes Hall will accommodate 134 resident students and three counselors and will also feature a new dining room, designed to accommodate 270 students, as well as a large recreation room on the ground floor.

Many out-of-town students will continue to live in homes in the college area, until such time as there are adequate accommodations on campus.

Sister M. Leona, dean of resident students for the past several years, has been transferred to St. Ann's Home, where she will be assistant to Sister M. Thomasina, the new administrator of that institution. Some of her duties have been assigned to Sister Mary Walter, former administrator of St. Ann's Home who has been designated director of residence facilities at the college. Sister Mary Austin, a member of the college music faculty, has been named dean of residents and will be in charge of resident student personnel activities.

## Cathedral Campaign Opens In Syracuse

The Greater Cathedral Appeal has been officially launched by Bishop Walter A. Foery of Syracuse.

The appeal is a drive to secure two-year pledges for repairing the Cathedral, a landmark in the downtown business area.

Bishop Foery said that preservation of the Cathedral "is a solemn duty which is imposed upon the conscience of a Bishop" and emphasized that renovation of the structure "is a project which is dear to all the people of the Cathedral and which is certainly dear to my own heart."

A committee of more than 400 men will conduct the drive which has a minimum goal of \$300,000.

Work on the church, which will mark the first time in more than 50 years that the cathedral has undergone major repairs, is expected to take a year to complete.

The official directory of the Diocese of Rochester for 1958-1959 made its appearance this week with the latest arrangement in contents and added information for the user.

His Excellency Bishop Kearney in the Foreword commends the service and expresses his appreciation for the publication.

Eighty-four pages and covers are given over to making available locations and telephone numbers of persons and places in the diocesan confines.

Diocesan offices, churches, clergy, rectories, schools, hospital and institutions are included. A map of the Rochester diocese and buyers guide are inserted.

Rites have Masses and devotions listed, confessions and baptisms and parish organizations and presidents as well as pastor, priests and school information.

Eucharistic fasts for laity, Holy Days of obligation and proper forms of addresses for religious are included.

## Cardinal Spellman Aids Polio Fight

New York City (AP)—Cardinal Spellman, Archbishop of New York, presented 10,000 Salk polio shots to the Consul General of Nicaragua here for use in the current polio epidemic in Managua and other sections of the Central American country.

In a letter accompanying the vaccine, addressed to President Luis Somoza of Nicaragua, the Cardinal said, "I have just heard of the illness of a considerable number of children in Nicaragua suffering from polio and it is a great consolation for me in the name of the Knights of Malta in the United States to forward immediately sufficient Salk anti-polio vaccine for 10,000 children."

Dallas — (NC) — Key members of the staff at St. Paul's Hospital, Dallas, whose duties prevent them from remaining in the place during most of their duty hours, have been issued a Motorola Handie Talkie—a transistorized low-powered radio receiver with built-in speaker and antennas so they can be paged from the hospital's central desk.
