

Nursing School Lists 46 Frosh

Forty-six freshmen will enter St. Joseph's Hospital School of Nursing on Sept. 2 to begin their three-year basic nursing program on the following day. These students, who will reside in the Edward J. Dunn Memorial Residence, represent 19 public high schools and seven Catholic high schools.

They were selected from a total of 110 applicants to this school, which offers a professional nursing program leading to a diploma in nursing. The preliminary period of 26 weeks include basic science courses and studies in religion, psychology, sociology and fundamentals of nursing practice and terminates in capping ceremony in the chapel located in the nurses' residence.

During the clinical period of two and one-half months the nursing student receives theory and practice in medical and surgical nursing, obstetric and pedi-

atric nursing and in tuberculosis and psychiatric nursing. The last semester of the nursing program offers the senior students the opportunity to develop technical skills and the ability to assume broader professional responsibility.

THE INCOMING freshman class will bring the enrollment of the School of Nursing to 116 students. Twenty-four nursing students from Nazareth College will increase the student body to 140 students.

Mrs. Mary Cain of Lowman, New York, will join the faculty of the School of Nursing as an assistant instructor in the physical and biological sciences. A graduate of Arnot Ogden Memorial Hospital School of Nursing, Mrs. Cain holds a bachelor's degree in science from Elmira College and was formerly a member of the faculty of St. Mary's School of Nursing, Evansville, Ill.

Connecticut Bars Bus Funds For Catholic Pupils

Hartford — (NC) — State funds cannot be used to provide transportation for Catholic school children, Attorney General John J. Bracken of Connecticut has ruled.

Two towns in Fairfield County, Brookfield and Newton, have already voted to provide free bus rides for parochial school students there.

Mr. Bracken's ruling means the two towns will not be reimbursed by the state for the cost of bus transportation for private school children. The state ordinarily divides school bus costs with towns.

The Attorney General's Assembly passed a law in 1957 providing that private school children could get free bus transportation if individual towns voted to give it to them.

Brookfield and Newton were the first towns in the state to hold referendums on the issue. In his statement, Mr. Bracken said: "The conclusion is reached that the reimbursements statutes are limited in their application to transportation of children attending public schools and cannot be extended to transportation of other children."

State reimbursements for public school bus transportation costs currently total about one million dollars to 121 towns.

About 150 children in Brookfield and about 190 in Newton are expected to get free bus rides to parochial schools, starting next month. Mr. Bracken's ruling will cost Brookfield about \$3,000 and Newton \$3,800.

Californians To Vote On Schools Tax

Los Angeles — (NC) — The Los Angeles Mirror News has labeled Proposition 16, an attempt to tax California's nonpublic schools, as a "shortsighted, narrow-minded scheme" and called for its defeat at the November election.

The editorial which appeared in the metropolitan afternoon newspaper declared: "You'll find a warmed-over measure called Proposition 16 on your November ballot. Its aim: to levy property taxes on nonprofit, church sponsored schools at the elementary and high school level."

"Obviously the proponents of this perennial plan want to curtail enrollment in California's 643 Catholic, 390 Protestant, 43 Jewish and nonsectarian schools. They want to make it economically impossible for these institutions, which today give education to 340,000 youngsters, to keep going."

Berlin Rites Link Divided Germany

Berlin — (NC) — A divided Germany was symbolically united here during the imposing public manifestations of the Katholikentag—the 78th national convention of German Catholics held from August 13 to 17.

More than 100,000 visitors from both East and West attended the meetings in the former German capital which is entirely surrounded by communist ruled territory—an island of the free world still partly accessible to those normally confined behind the Iron Curtain.

RED RULERS of East Germany raised no objections to the mass meeting of the convention being held simultaneously in the Soviet district of Berlin and the western sectors.

They authorized the passage of Catholics from the Federal Republic and from the Soviet zone of Germany who wished to attend the congress to profess their solidarity in the Faith regardless of political boundaries.

On the official opening night of the convention 52,000 visitors from the East and 20,000 from the West attended meetings held simultaneously in West Berlin's Deutschland Hall, and in East Berlin's Werner Seidenbinder Hall where Soviet Premier Nikita Khrushchev himself addressed a mass communist meeting recently.

It was moving to observe the difference of atmosphere prevailing among those who came from the West and the others who live under communist domination.
