Cardinal Spellman Aids Polio Fight

New York — (RNS) — Cardinal Spellman, Archbishop of New York, presented 10,000 Salk polio shots to the Consul General of Nicaragua here for use in the current polio epidemic in Managua and other sections of the Central American country.

In a letter accompanying the vaccine, addressed to President Luis Somoza of Nicaragua, the Cardinal said, "I have just heard of the illness of a considerable number of children in Nicaragua suffering from polio and it is a great consolation for me in the name of the Knights of Malta in the United States to forward immediately sufficient Salk anti-polio vaccine for 10,000 children."

or from 2 until 4 for the uniforms.


