Dedication Rites Held For St. Nicholas Church

Solemn dedication services for the new St. Nicholas Ukrainian Catholic church were held last Sunday with the Most Rev. Ambrose Senyshyn, OSBM, Bishop of the Stamford, Conn. Diocese officiating.

The new edifice, erected at a cost of nearly \$250,000, is located at McCann's Blvd. and McCaulley Ave. in Elmira Heights.

An honor guard from Feshon-Macchur Post, Catholic War Veterans, headed a procession from the temporary rectory that included Bishop Senyshyn, several priests, church trustees, altar boys and a group of young girls attired in native Ukrainian dresses.

Very Rev. Waldimir B. Duhovich is pastor of the new edifice.

Following the church services a dinner was served for over 400 in the church annex. The dinner was prepared and served by the members of the Mothers Club.

Bishop Senyshyn in his talk at the banquet told the gathering in part, "There are moments in the lives of people which leave upon the memory never-to-be-effaced impressions which are left for generations to come. To such memorable times, which the Lord has given us, is the dedication of the new St. Nicholas Ukrainian

Catholic Church here in Elmira Heights.

"When we consider today's event, we find that it resembles the dedication of Solomon's Temple in Jerusalem.

"The dedication of St. Nicholas church bears a resemblance to the Temple of Solomon. This House of God was built by the means of the gifts, donations of our good Ukrainian people—by you, its steadfast parishioners. In you, your children and your children's children, God willing, will offer prayers of petition, thanksgiving and adoration to the Almighty Father for many, many years to come. In it you will participate and observe the liturgy which will continue to receive the same customs of our beautiful Byzantine Rite and pass them down to your descendants. God bestows His blessing upon you and upon the erection of your church.

"Sincerely I congratulate all who sacrificed time, labor and gifts for this noble enterprise, you are to be ranked with Christ's Apostles, with our Ukrainian Princes of old and with our early pioneer predecessors in America. May the Lord grant you blessings a hundredfold, and may the Mother of God guide you, comfort you and aid you every moment of your lives," he concluded.
