Marine Band To Visit Rochester

The 160-year-old United States Marine Band, the oldest military symphonic organization in the country will give two performances at the Eastman Theatre, Rochester, Saturday, Oct. 4, as part of the presidentially approved tour of 14 states and 63 cities.

The Civic Music Association has announced that matinee and evening concerts will be presented at the Eastman Theatre, with musical works by the world's finest composers and stirring marches which have brought the Marine Band acclaim from visiting dignitaries of almost every country in the world.

Under the leadership of Major Albert Schoepfer, Rochester native and Eastman School of Music graduate, the colorful Marine Band is known to millions of Americans through its annual tours, its frequent radio broadcasts and television appearances, and its concert series in the nation's Capital.



English Catholics Start 'Sentry' Plan

Manchester, England —(NC)—A "TV watchdog" plan has been launched in the Salford and Shrewsbury dioceses of northwest England to keep a Catholic eye and ear on television programs.

It was announced here that the Knights of St. Columba are organizing "look-listen" circles in every parish to report regularly and frankly to producers on the services they provide for over half the homes of Britain.

The idea was started by Father Angelus Andrew O.F.M., Catholic adviser to the British Broadcasting Corporation, which runs the non-commercial general TV network. Britain's independent TV channel, which carries advertising, is also being studied.

Critics Praise Film On Rome Hospital

Venice — (NC) — The Ninth International Exposition of Documentary Films here has singled out for praise a short film telling the history and work of the Hospital of the Holy Ghost in Rome.

The full-color documentary details the past and present history of the hospital which is linked closely with the history of the Anglo-Saxons who came to Rome in the 8th century. The scope of the movie begins in the times of the Roman Emperor Nero and ends with the modern hospital, its medical staff and the technical and spiritual training given the nuns who staff it.

The hospital, not far from Nero's garden where St. Peter and many early Christian martyrs were put to death, is near the modern hospital, St. Peter's Basilica.

Catholic Theatre Seventh Season To Start

The Catholic Theatre of Rochester, located at Clifford and Hudson Avenues, has announced the opening of its seventh season in Rochester. The group will begin the 1953-54 season with its 13th production, "The Beautiful People," on Sept. 26-28.

A comedy in two acts, the play was originally produced on Broadway by its author, William Saroyan. It opened at the Lyceum Theatre in 1941 and played for 64 performances.

Wilford H. Scott will direct the group's production. During the 1952-53 season, Scott will also direct the group's production of "Othello," by William Shakespeare.

Religious Shows Attract Viewers

London, England —(NC)—TV viewers throughout this country are showing widespread and deep interest in moral and religious issues, an official of a British commercial television company said here.

Howard Thomas, managing director of the A.B.C. TV network, stated that this belief is justified by audience reaction to three religious programs presented every Sunday—the Morning Church Service, the Sunday Break and Living You Life.

He further backed his statement by saying that the audience he referred to, represented "a fairly precise cross-section of the whole population of this country."

Thomas made these declarations in a booklet entitled "The Church and Television" issued by the A.B.C. television company. He also noted that in recent months the semi-official television network of the British Broadcasting Corporation has been giving more attention to religious programs with the help of clergymen, including Catholic priests.

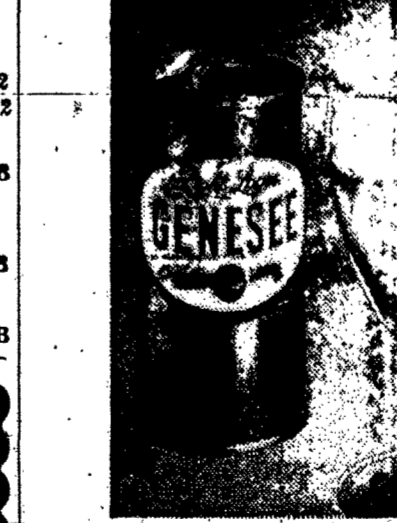
