Students Discover

Latin Is No Dead Language

Latin may be a dead language but it was very much alive on the University of Michigan campus this summer.

This is the opinion of Nazareth Academy and Saint Agnes High School students who were among the 800 attending the National Classical Junior League convention held there Aug. 17-21.

Claudia in togas of ancient Rome, Mary Ellen Carr, Automobile Student, Suzanne Tracy, Ann Weinger of Nazareth Academy and Judith Burns and Barbara Neidick of St. Agnes High School participated in discussions and attended lectures on the social and political aspects of Roman and Greek civilization. They were accompanied by Sister Dorothy of Nazareth Academy and Sister M. Edwina of St. Agnes High School.

Professor Gerald F. Else, chairman of the University of Michigan department of classical studies, rendered tribute to the junior Classical League which has numbered 500 members and had representatives from 44 states attending the convention.

"The study of Latin," he stated, "has been in about a general decline in recent years. But the language has terrific vitality and has proved it is one of the liveliest subjects in the curriculum." Dr. Else said.

The general effort of teachers of the classics in organizing the League of Latin clubs is to a great extent responsible for the renewed interest in the classics, the department head believes.

Dr. Else pointed out that today's problem pertains to a shortage of Latin teachers to meet the needs of increased enrollment in high school and college classes. League members, he said, may fill the gap in the future.
