

# Bishop Casey Will Bless New Religion School

The new Gates-Chill "School of Religion" on Wegman Road will be blessed by Auxiliary Bishop Lawrence B. Casey this Sunday, Sept. 14, at 4 p.m.

The three room, brick catechetical center will provide religious instruction facilities for students attending the just-completed Gates-Chill central high school, only 200 feet away.

Contributing proportionate amounts to finance the \$17,500 office are the four area parishes: St. Theodore's, St. Helen's and Holy Ghost, Gates, and St. Pius X, Chill.

Pupils from these four parishes are enrolled in the nearby public high school.

Priests of the Diocese are invited to attend Sunday's blessing rite and to inspect the catechetical center afterward. An open house is scheduled until 6 p.m. for public viewing of the new building.

CONSTRUCTION began June 1 on land donated by Mr. and Mrs. Edward G. Melsenzahl, 976 Wegman Rd. Parishioners aided in building the center. Amico Brothers were general contractors. The building matches in style the new public school.

Father John J. Steger, assistant pastor at St. Theodore's, has supervised the project. He won approval for the structure at a May 28th Gates zoning board meeting.

First religion classes in the new center are scheduled to begin Sept. 21.
