### Federal Funds Offered For Loans, Equipment

Washington (NC)—An appropriation of \$10 million by Congress has put into immediate effect the \$887 aid-to-education bill signed into law by President Eisenhower and providing some benefits to private, nonprofit schools.

Launching of the education program under the terms of the National Defense Education Act of 1958 was disclosed here at a meeting of executive secretaries of educational organizations having offices in the District of Columbia.

Present at the meeting was Mr. Frederick G. Howard, director of the Department of Education, National Catholic Welfare Conference. The meeting was called by the Office of Education of the U.S. Department of Health, Education and Welfare.

**THE PURPOSE** of the meeting was to discuss and put into immediate operation the program of the education act which President Eisenhower signed.

The President also signed into law a bill providing exemptions for private nonprofit schools and colleges from certain federal estate taxes.

The education act will enable private nonprofit schools to share in federal loans and funds for equipment.

It provides 283 million dollars for loans to college students, with the loans to be administered through the schools. The government will furnish 30 per cent of the money and the colleges 10 per cent. Individual students will be eligible for loans up to \$1,000 per year, but the total available to any one student is limited to \$5,000.

### Far East Films Will Be Made

New York (NC)—Father Albert J. Nevins, M.M., editor of Maryknoll magazine and director of mass communications for the Maryknoll Fathers, has left for the Far East to film a new series of movies on the peoples of Korea, Japan, Formosa, Hong Kong and the Philippines.

Father Nevins is the director and founder of World Home Movies, an organization sponsored by the Maryknoll Fathers which produces motion pictures about peoples of mission lands.

### God Stays In Pennsylvania

Harrisburg (NC)—The State Commission on Constitution Revision has decided to keep the word "God" in a section of the constitution dealing with qualifications of office holders.

Section 4, Article I of the constitution of 1874 states "No person who acknowledges the being of a God and a future state of awards and punishments shall, on account of his religious sentiments, be disqualified to hold any public or private office or place of trust or profit under this Commonwealth."

An original revision suggested by a commission subordinate omitting the name of God brought such a wave of protests that the commission decided to leave the section un-revised.

Such an ambitious work ordinarily would be impossible in the normal Catholic Hour production schedule, Work said. "But working in cooperation with the university makes it possible for this to be produced as a result of a year's planning, rehearsing and perfecting."

Dick Walsh, director of NCCM's television work, is coordinating the project with Dr. Paul of the university and with Denis Anne and Martin Hoyle of the NBC staff. It was announced.
