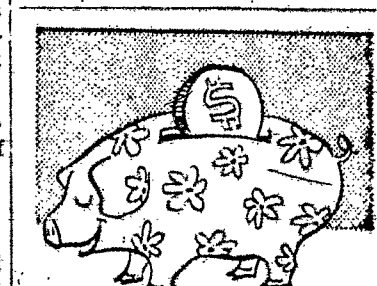
Members were invited to the annual Communion breakfast of the Rochester Council of Catholic Nurses Sunday, Sept. 21.
