Solemn Requiem Mass for Sister M. Antoinette Tiernan of the Congregation of the Sisters of St. Joseph was offered in Nazareth Convent, Pittsford, Monday, Sept. 8.

Sister Antoinette died in St. Joseph's Hospital, Elmira, Friday morning, Sept. 5, 1953. She was a former principal and teacher in Rochester and other diocesan parish schools.

Celebrant of the Mass was Rev. Michael Tydings assisted by Monsignor Dennis W. Hekey, deacon, and the Rev. Edward E. Steinkirchner, subdeacon. The Rev. Albert H. Schnack was master of ceremonies and the Rev. William H. Shannon, thurifer.
