Sister Antoinette Rites Conducted At Motherhouse

Solemn Requiem Mass for Sister M. Antoinette Tiernan of the Congregation of the Sisters of St. Joseph was offered in Nazareth Convent, Pittsford, Monday, Sept. 8.

Sister Antoinette died in St. Joseph's Hospital, Elmira, Friday morning, Sept. 5, 1953. She was a former principal and teacher in Rochester and other diocesan parish schools.

Celebrant of the Mass was Rev. Michael Tydings assisted by Monsignor Dennis W. Hekey, deacon, and the Rev. Edward E. Steinkirchner, subdeacon. The Rev. Albert H. Schnacky was master of ceremonies and the Rev. William H. Shannon, thurifer.

After joining the community in 1922, Sister Antoinette taught in Holy Apostles, Immaculate Conception, Holy Rosary and St. Bridget School, Rochester; St. Mary School, Canandaigua, and later served as principal of St. Peter and Paul School, Elmira; St. Patrick School, Dansville and St. John the Evangelist School, Spencerport. She taught at St. Francis Xavier School, Rochester until her retirement in 1952.

Sister is survived by several nieces and nephews.
