

Geneva School Enrollment Up

Geneva — Regular class sessions began Monday in the local parochial schools and De Sales High School. Half-day sessions were in operation since Thursday, Sept. 4.

Traditional opening Mass was celebrated by Bishop Kearney in St. Stephen's Church on Monday. The parochial schools face an enrollment hike with close to 1,700 pupils expected in the grades and kindergarten through 12th grade.

Large kindergarten enrollments were anticipated in both St. Stephen's and St. Francis de Sales parishes, boosting registration in these two schools to some 600 students in St. Francis de Sales, and more than 716 in St. Stephen's.

DE SALES HIGH School administrators figure an enrollment of about 325 as compared with 315 students last year.
