

#### Naples Miracle 'On Schedule'

Naples-(NC)-The "standing miracle" of the liquefaction of what is believed to be the blood of St. Januarius took place on the feast of the saint -the beloved San Gennaro of the Neapolitans.

The alleged blood of the saint, normally caked and dried, is preserved in a plass phial in a side chapel of the Naples cathedral.

On the morning of the saint's feast, September, 19, the contents of the phial become liquid after the priests and faithful were at prayer for 10 min-
