

# Elmira Host To Newman Clubs

A leadership conference of the Empire Province of Newman Clubs will be conducted by the Rev. Charles W. Albright, C.S., of Washington, D.C. in Elmira for three days commencing Friday, Oct. 3.

Elmira College Newman Club will be host to the conference which comprises all clubs in New York State outside of the New York Metropolitan area.

FATHER ALBRIGHT is executive secretary of the National Newman Club Federation. He took over the duties in July, 1955 after several years in Newman Club work.

He was assistant director of Newman Hall at the University of California in Berkeley for four years from his ordination in 1949 to the fall of 1953. He was transferred by his Paulist superiors to Wayne State University Newman Foundation, De-

troit, as associate director. During his two years in Detroit he was also associate editor of Newman Review, a quarterly magazine and was province chaplain of the Ohio Valley province of the National Newman Club Federation.

REV. JOHN T. WALSH, assistant pastor of St. Mary Church, Elmira is chaplain of the Elmira Club. Judy O'Brien of Elmira Heights is conference chairman.

Registrations will open at Mark Twain Hotel, Friday, Oct. 3 at 6:30 p.m. A general welcome program and office hour will follow. A full day of discussion will be held Saturday starting at 9 a.m. in Elmira College.

### Dominicans Slate Rosary Novena

A public novena will open at the Dominican Monastery on Saturday, Sept. 27 at 7:30 p.m. in preparation for the feast of the Holy Rosary.

Services will be held each evening including Sunday, Sept. 28 through Saturday, Oct. 4. Mass each day will be at 7 a.m. in the Monastery Chapel. Daily Mass is recommended as a part of this Novena, either in a parish church or at the monastery.

THE SERVICES each evening will consist of the Rosary, the Litany of Our Blessed Mother and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. The closing services of the novena will be held at an outdoor altar on Rosary Hill, Sunday, Oct. 12 at 3:30 p.m.

The Feast was instituted, on Oct. 7, 1571 by Pope Pius IV, as a commemoration of a victory gained at Lepanto, against the threatened invasion of Europe by the Moslems.

### College Receives Eastman Grant

Nazareth College has received a grant of \$10,000 for the Eastman Kodak Company as part of the company's plan of continuing aid-to-education program, which this year gave private colleges and universities grants of \$285,000.

The grant to the local college, conducted by the Sisters of St. Joseph, was based on five graduates of the college who have served with Kodak for more than five years and who are still employed by the firm.

UNDER THE direct grant plan payments of \$500 are provided for each year of normal academic work completed by the Kodak employee at the institution from which he was graduated.

The work must have been in a regular degree program at either the undergraduate or graduate level.
