Bishop Pays Tribute To Nuns At Mass

A tribute to two nuns "who have been consequential figures in the history of St. Mary's Hospital, and whose deaths occurred so close together," was the Requiem Mass, Bishop Kearney celebrated for them in the hospital chapel, Wednesday morning, he said.

The two Daughters of Charity honored were Sisters Martina, former administrator who died Sept. 13, and Sister Hilda, chief pharmacist who died Sept. 22, 1938.

BISHOP KEARNEY was assisted by Rev. Edward J. McAniff and Rev. Paul G. Wohlfab at the Mass which taxed the chapel capacity. Staff members and wives, hospital personnel, board members and nurses attended. Also in the Sanctuary were Monsignor John E. Maney, chancellor of the Diocese and Rev. Harold Higgins.

St. Mary's Hospital, Bishop Kearney said is "a monument to beloved, devoted efficient Sister Martina. Its creation was her dream. It leaves a monument in the minds of many, not only to her zeal and ambition but to her tender devotion and personal concern for all who came to St. Mary's."

THE BISHOP compared Sister Hilda to the Good Samaritan. Her services were not known so much to others, but from her pharmacy, she dispensed the drugs that were necessary to destroy germs of disease and bring peace and contentment, the Bishop said.

"They were two remarkable women and a wonderful crown must be theirs in Heaven," he said.

A Mass to be celebrated by Monsignor Charles F. Shay on Sunday, Sept. 25 at 9 a.m. for Sister Martina was requested by St. Mary's Nurses Alumnae and veteran employees will assist at another Mass on Oct. 12, at 9 a.m., both in the hospital chapel.

Fund Workers Hear Priest

Advance gift workers in Auburn's United Fund campaign, now in progress to raise \$323,301 for that city's 26 health, welfare and recreational agencies, heard Very Rev. Msgr. James H. Cuffney speak to them on "The Meaning of Charity" last week.

Father Cuffney, who has been an active participant in Community Chest and United Fund activities in other communities, told the Auburn workers that "when we consider charity as love of God and love of mankind we have placed our finger on the basic principle of United Fund giving."

The Monsignor said charity was "not the doing out of alms to the unfortunate" or "philanthropic gifts given by business tycoons."

Charity, he said, goes deeper. "It is love, love, first of all, of God. Then it is love of mankind."

Msgr. Cuffney told the Cayuga County United Fund workers that "you here today have that charity within your hearts whether you realize it or not."

"If you didn't you wouldn't be here. You wouldn't be making a sacrifice of time to accept the work you have set out to do."

"The United Fund work you are doing is a great work," Msgr. Cuffney continued. "You are moved to do it because of the charity in your heart. You are moved by the love of your fellow man."

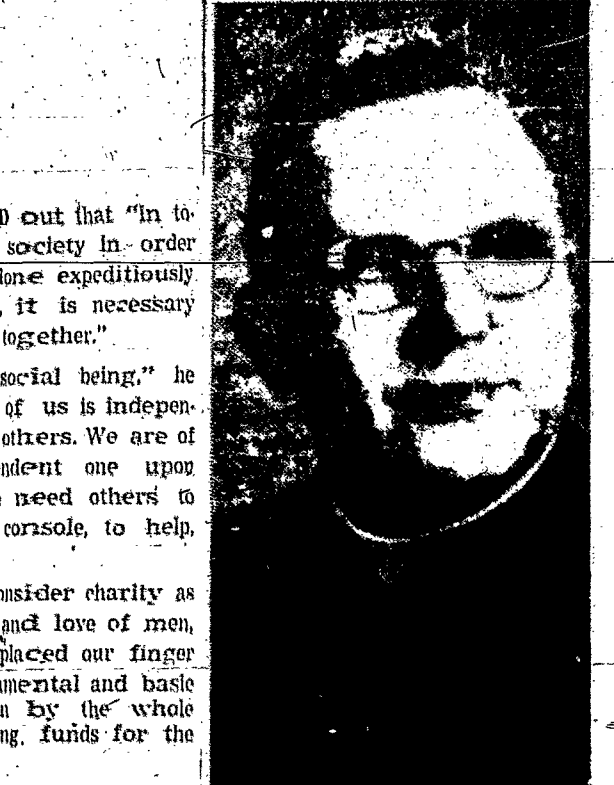

After his ordination from St. Andrew's and St. Bernard's seminaries in 1933, Father Cuffney was assigned to St. Thomas Church in Rochester. In 1940 and 1941 he was assistant at St. Mary's, Auburn.

While pastor at St. Patrick's, Seneca Falls, Father Cuffney was president of the Community Chest for two years, campaign chairman for two years and a church director. He was the first campaign director of that city's combined agency drive.

Previous to going to Auburn as administrator at St. Mary's, Msgr. Cuffney was pastor of St. Mary's, Canandaigua, and procurator of St. Bernard's Seminary.
