There will be entries from surrounding towns along with the usual local entries, with about 100 horses competing for trophies and cash.

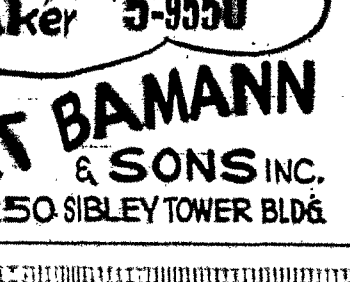

French, 556 Wellington Avenue, and active in social agency fields, and Horace P. Gioia, 398 Bressford Road, prominent food manufacturer and long active in community affairs.

Catholic Family Center Needs Volunteers

The Catholic Family Center is in urgent need for women who can volunteer their time as drivers to help out the program of the center.

The appeal for these 'ladies of charity' as they are called by the center, was issued by Mrs. Mary Dawson, director of the service. THE SERVICE has been in operation for the last two years and the volunteers, who must have a car at their disposal, transport children to hospital clinics, the dental dispensary and other places.

"Right now, we have about 10 women who are available for this service, but we need at least 10 more," Mrs. Dawson said.

"When these 'ladies of charity' are not available the social workers have to take time out from their regular work to transport the children," she added. "Any woman who has the time to perform this duty would really perform a corporal work of mercy," she added.
