THE NAME OF THE "Great" Pharaoh of the 19th dynasty, whose oppression of the Israelites in Egypt resulted in their migration from captivity to the "Promised Land" of Palestine, was in hieroglyphics on foundation stones at the base of a gate in a six-foot thick brick wall.

Go To Church Or Jail, Says Judge

Santa Fe — (RNS) — A Santa Fe woman charged with cashing a \$80 welfare check that didn't belong to her was ordered by District Judge David Carmody to attend church with her children every Sunday for two years or go to jail.

The woman was sentenced to two to five years in prison for the offense. Judge Carmody suspended the sentence on the condition that she go to church faithfully for two years.

Christmas Crib Faces Court Ban

White Plains — (RNS) — A group of 28 Ossining, N.Y., residents sought an injunction in State Supreme Court here against the erection of a Nativity creche on the lawn of their city's junior-senior high school.

Claiming that it is unconstitutional to display a religious symbol on public property, they asked Justice Elbert T. Gallagher to forbid future display of the creche which has been installed at the school during the last two Christmas seasons. Suit for the injunction was initiated last year.

Among the witnesses were psychologists, teachers, an Episcopal minister and several rabbis representing the Reform, Orthodox and Conservative branches of Judaism. The rabbis claimed that the display was "inconsistent" with the beliefs of Jewish school children.

Under cross examination by attorneys for the defendants, who are members of the board of education of Union Free School District No. 1 and a 15-member creche committee, some of the plaintiffs agreed that the creche did carry historical significance.

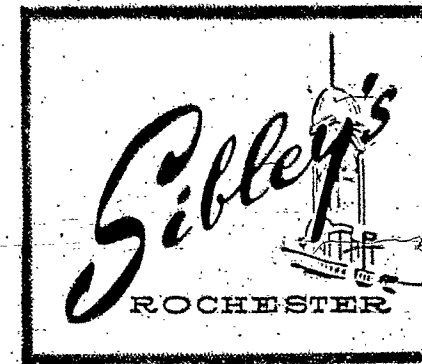
