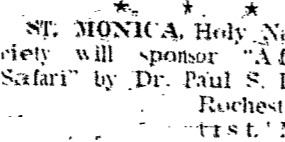

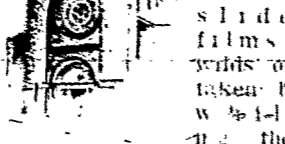

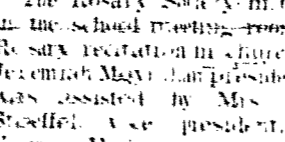

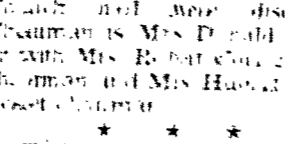

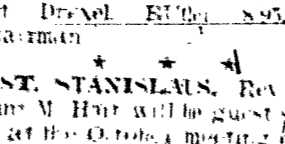

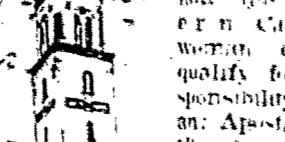

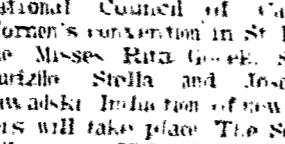

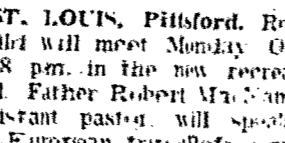

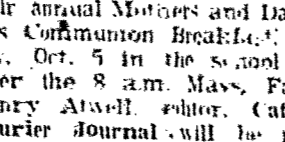

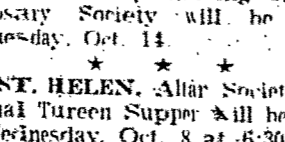

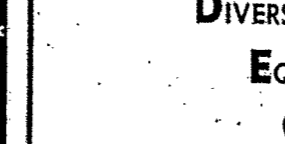

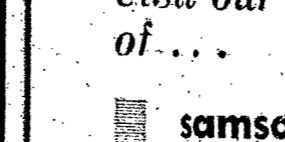

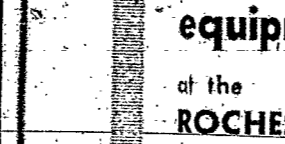

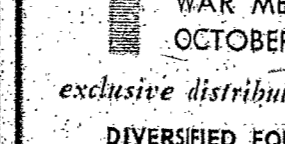

The missionary quoted Pope Pius XII in an address last year to the students of Rome: "Do not be a soft and lazy youth. Rather, be a burning youth, an ardent youth. Enkindle and make burn brightly the fire which Jesus came to bring to the world."
