### 5 Students Named Semi-Finalists

Five students from three Diocesan high schools have been named semi-finalists in the National Merit Scholarship competition, as a result of an educational development test taken last April.

The semi-finalists now face another three-hour examination which will further substantiate their high scores. Those who repeat their high scores on the second test will then become finalists in the competition.

As finalists the students will be eligible for the estimated \$3-million in scholarship awards sponsored by over eighty business and industrial organizations, professional societies, foundations, individuals, and the National Merit Scholarship Corporation itself. About May 1, at least 725 young people will be named the merit scholars of 1959. Each Merit Scholarship is a four-year award.

The five students are Marie Phillips and Judith Anderson from Our Lady of Mercy High School; Brian L. Gibson and Eugene T. Clifford from Aquinas Institute; and Jean Meeh from Nazareth Academy.

The five students are among 10,000 of the highest scorers on the National Merit Scholarship qualifying test given in over 14,000 schools last Spring.

The semi-finalists outscored over 479,000 classmates from public, private and parochial high schools in the United States and its possessions.

Through their high scoring, the students moved a step closer to an estimated \$3-million in merit scholarships.
