health bars them from making the journey to Rome.

The latter are 86-year-old Georges Cardinal Grente, Bishop of Le Mans, France; Jose Cardinal Caro Rodriguez, Archbishop of Santiago, Chile, who is 82 and the oldest member of the Sacred College; and Thomas Cardinal Tien, exiled Archbishop of Peking, now in West Germany, recovering from a recent automobile accident.

Each of the cardinals attending the conclave will be permitted to have two companions or attendants. Also in the secret, walled-up chamber will be a religious to act as confessor, two physicians, a surgeon and a pharmacist with one or two assistants.

**THE ACCOMMODATIONS** for the cardinals will be simple and austere. The Princess of the Church will occupy rooms furnished with an iron bed with spring mattress, a seated chair, a small writing table and chair, a kneeling bench, a crucifix, a washstand with a plain basin and a clothes rack.

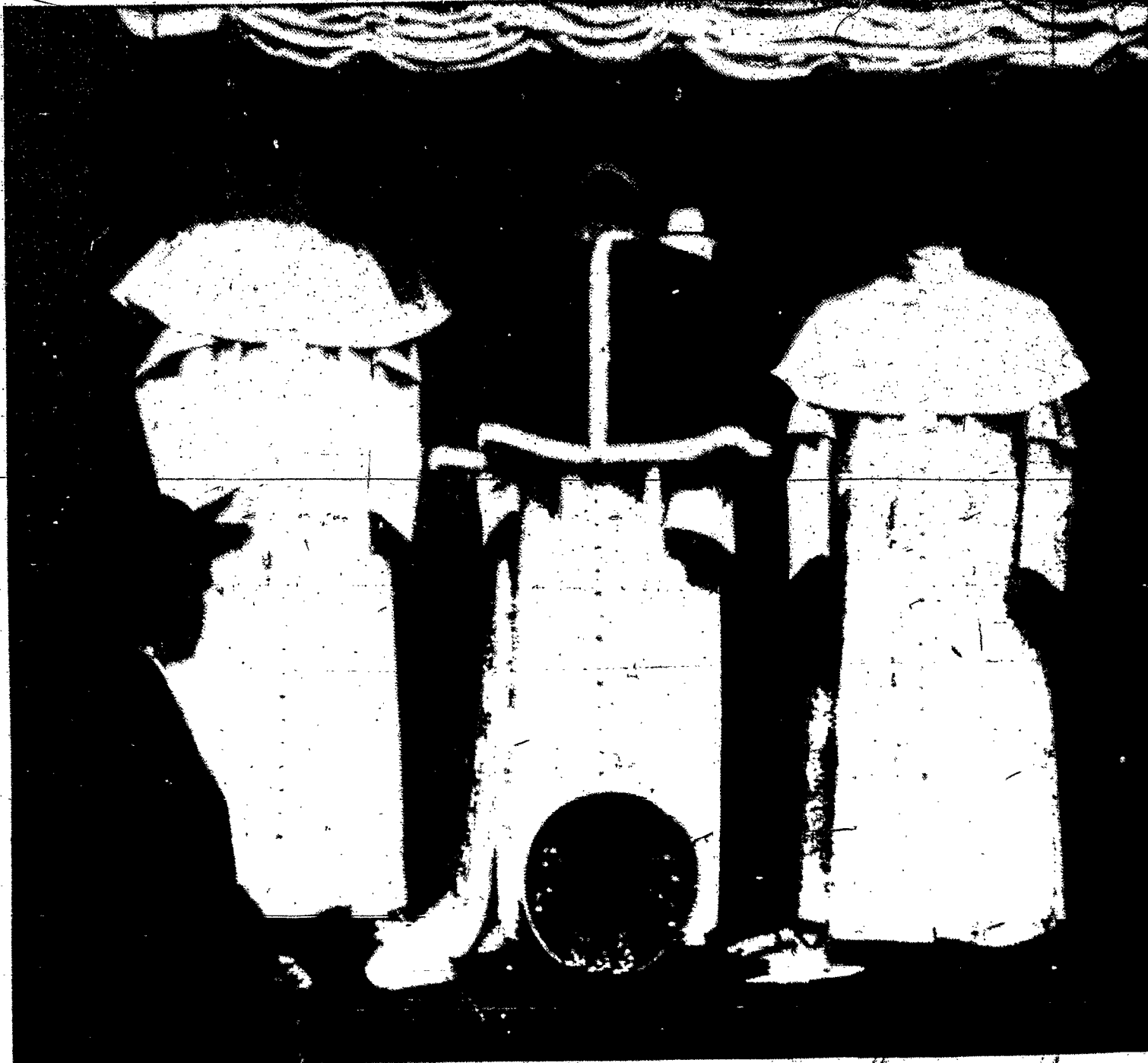
Until 1030, priests and laymen, including emperors and members of the Roman nobility, took an active and direct part in the election of a Pope. However, the Lateran Synod of that year decreed that in the future only the cardinals were to have the right of election.

In theory, any male Catholic who has reached the age of reason can be chosen Pope. If a layman were elected he would be ordained a priest and consecrated a bishop in short order. However, since 1378 only members of the College of Cardinals have been elected to the Chair of Peter. Although nationality plays no official part in papal elections, no non-Italian has been elected since Dutch-born Adrian VI reigned from 1522-23.

## Prelate Wears Saint's Ring

Newcastle-on-Tyne (NC)—A ring from 1,300 years ago by St. Cuthbert, apostle of north England, was worn by Bishop James Cunningham as he was enthroned as ninth Bishop of Hexham and Newcastle.

Bishop Cunningham was installed in St. Mary's Cathedral here in ceremonies presided over by Archbishop John C. Heenan of Liverpool.

Workers strained to lower the heavy coffin to the crypt near the tomb of St. Peter. The resting place of Pius XII is opposite the Clementine Chapel where only a few years ago he consecrated an altar in honor of the Prince of the Apostles.

The tomb is plain, simple carriage marble bearing the inscription, Pius PP XII.

It is in a small chapel showing modern architectural influences.

**TUESDAY MORNING** there were three small bouquets of flowers.

Guards at the tomb kept people from touching Rosaries to the tomb—except they permitted a crippled paralytic woman to bless her Rosary by touching it to the tomb of the saintly Pontiff.

Already there is a remarkable similarity the way the people seek to venerate the tomb of Pope Pius XII as they have the tomb of St. Peter.

## U.S. Delegates At Funeral

Washington (NC)—President Eisenhower has named three distinguished Americans as representatives at the funeral services for Pope Pius XII in Vatican City. They are Secretary of State John Foster Dulles, former U.S. Ambassador to Italy Clare Booth Luce and Atomic Energy Commission Chairman John A. McCone.

The President attended a Pontifical Mass of Requiem for the Pope offered by Archbishop Amleto Giovanni Cicognani, Apostolic Delegate to the United States, this past Tuesday in St. Matthew's Cathedral here.

# Faith And Friend Take Mike To Lourdes

Los Angeles (NC)—Mike Heib, a man with a partially deadened nervous system and a living faith, is on his way to Lourdes by airplane to learn God's will.

Mike, 42, an ex-GI who was last overseas when he took part in North African landings in World War II, has had multiple sclerosis for 15 years.

He has been in St. John of God Hospital here for the past

18 months—unable to move a muscle.

**ON HIS TRIP** to Lourdes he is completely dependent on his wife, Mary, member from St. Vibiana's Cathedral parish.

The two are part of an air flight of the handicapped that left New York the weekend of Sept. 28.

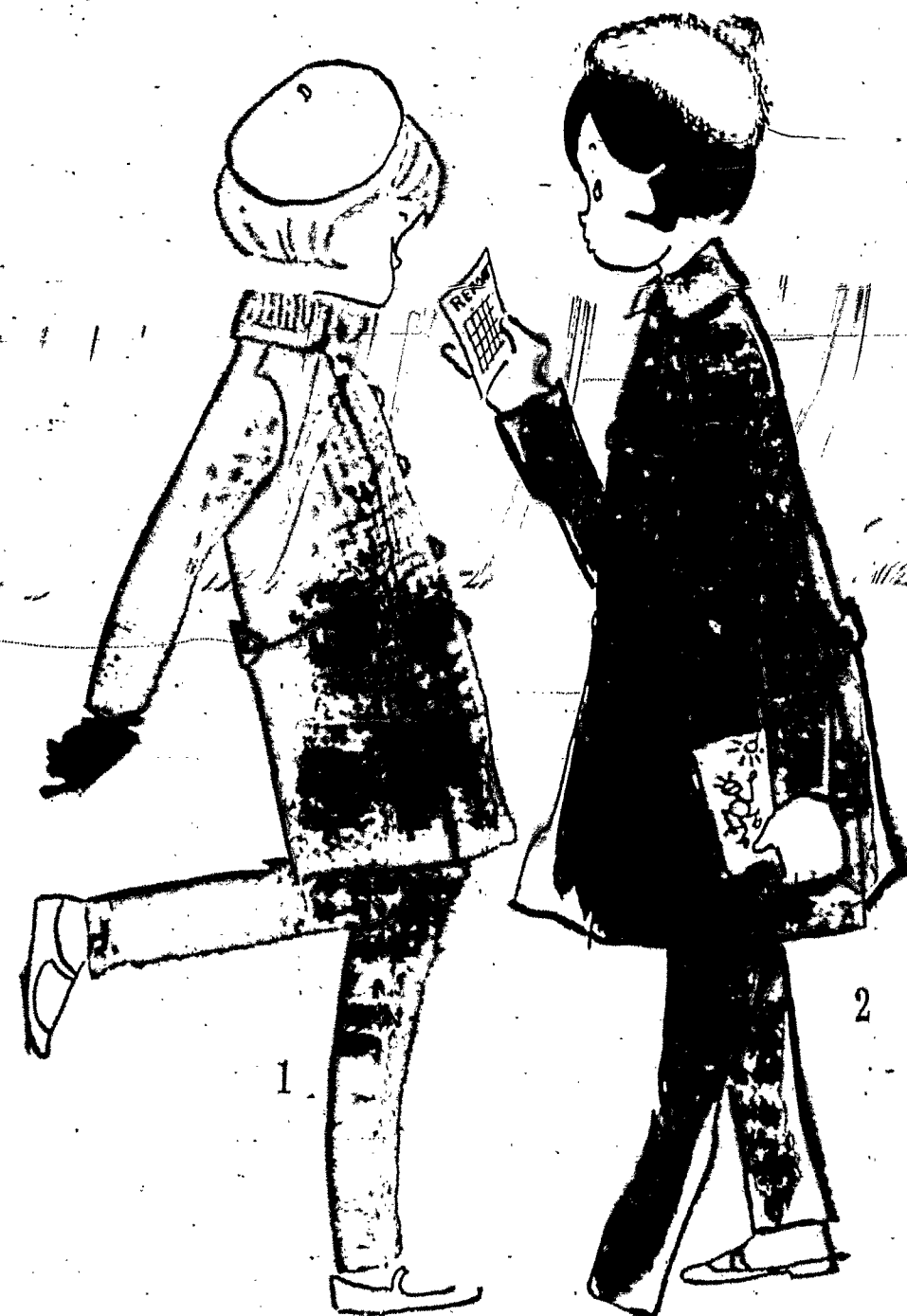
Hardly able to speak, but mentally clear as a bell, Mike is praying for a miracle. He wants to be cured.
