Jews Mourn Pope's Death

Rome—(RNS)—Chief Rabbi Ello Toaff of Rome, in a message here, said the Jews of Italy "participate in the sorrow of the entire Christian world" over the death of Pope Pius XII.

"More than anyone else," he said, "Jews have experienced the great pity and immense generosity of Pius XII during the infamous war years of persecution and terror."

Rabbi Toaff said the Pope's "Jewish fellow citizens" remember particularly his generous promise to contribute to the 110 pounds in gold demanded by the German command as ransom for the Jewish community of Rome.

"They recall with unending gratitude," he wrote, "the order issued by the Pontiff to open the doors of convents and parish houses for Jews following the Pope's order annulling laws that had excluded Jews of all social conditions and had prohibited them, severely limiting every change involved in protecting their associated Jewish brethren."

ing the limits of the Vatican City State.

The little city's sovereign was returning.

As soon as the funeral cortege came into view of St. Peter's, the basilica's bells began to toll. The red-shrouded hearse, surmounted by four life-sized golden angels and a gold tiara, moved down an avenue of wooden barriers that held back surging throngs. The Italian gendarmes' band played a funeral dirge.

Above the band music and bells rose the voices of the chanters, singing a psalm that might very well have been composed for Pius XII himself: "I will teach the unjust Thy ways, and the wicked shall be converted to Thee."

Through St. Peter's Square, packed with almost 300,000 mourners, passed the procession, now led by a detachment of Swiss Guards which had met it at the Vatican boundaries. It passed around the obelisk in St. Peter's Square and to the steps leading up to the great central door of the basilica.

The doors were opened wide and one could see the brilliantly lighted interior.

Night was falling now. Candles flickered in the hands of the faithful across the crowded square. Floodlights from the roofs of apostolic palaces bathed the mass of humanity. Loud speakers that had often carried the living voice of the Pontiff now took up the funeral strains from inside the basilica and chanted them over the piazza.

of the Confession, under the dome of the great church, and placed on a bier prepared for it.

Absolution was imparted by Msgr. Beniamino Nardone, Dean of the Vatican Canons, as the "Benedictus" was chanted.

The Pontiff's remains lay slightly uptilted on the bier, facing the body of the church. The Noble Guards took up posts as guards of honor around the body while 24 candles burned throughout the night. There the body remained until the fourth night, Monday, October 13, when it was buried inside the basilica near the remains of Pius X, whom Pope Pius XII had canonized.

The funeral Mass is scheduled for Sunday, October 19.

On Monday, October 20, a Solemn Mass for Pius XII will be offered in the basilica by Archbishop Giuseppe Pietta, Apostolic Nuncio to Italy. It will be attended by President Giovanni Gronchi of Italy, members of the government and governmental employees.

On the second day after the Pope's death the body of Pius XII lay in state before the Altar of the Confession, while countless thousands of faithful filed past from early morning until late night.

The central door of the basilica was closed and the two side doors were used, the right one for those entering and the left one for those leaving.

Inside the basilica the mourners walked in abreast through an aisle partitioned by wooden barricades. They moved

In slowly and quietly, up the gospel side of the church, past the bier, around the main altar and out again down the epistle side.

Gendarmes stationed at intervals kept the crowd moving.

Along the side altars priests in black were offering Mass for the repose of the dead Pontiff's soul. In all other churches throughout the city every Mass included by order of the Vicariate of Rome, prayers "for the election of a Supreme Pontiff."

As the Pope lay in state in the basilica he wore a white cassock, rochet, alb, red dalmatic, red chasuble, a fanon (cape fitting over the head) a pallium, mitre, red gloves, a ring and red slippers.

The second day's Requiem Mass of the nine-day mourning period was offered in St. Peter's Basilica by the Papal Sacristan, Bishop Peter Canisius van Lierde, in the presence of dignitaries and officials of the Papal Court. It was the second of nine Masses to be celebrated.

Behind the scenes in the Vatican great activity was in progress, consisting of making preparations for the coming solemnities of the Pope's burial and the carrying on of the interregnum government of the Church.

Workers were beginning to seal off the area which would enclose the conclave of cardinals, and apartments on the top floor of the Vatican Palace were being readied for the participating cardinals who would elect the next pope.

Belgrade—(RNS)—News of Pope Pius XII's death was published in Yugoslavia's Communist-controlled press in 59 words on inside pages, without any comment.

The news also was broadcast by the Budapest Radio, but only in the briefest form.
