Seniors at McQuaid Jesuit High School will get a mental workout, during the third week of October. They will take a series of scholarship qualifying tests on the 15th, the 16th, and 21st.

The six and one-half hour Regents Scholarship Examination on Wednesday was the starter. Scholarships granted to the winners in this competition will enable them to go to any college in the state. Seven McQuaid seniors were winners of last year's scholarships.

Forty seniors took the 3-hour Regents Engineering and Science Scholarship Examination yesterday. Winners in this competition who plan to study engineering or science in college will get scholarship aid.

Four seniors were recently named semi-finalists in the National Merit Scholarship qualifying tests held last April.

They are Daniel Doell of 72 Boardman St., Philip Knaut of 922 Winona Blvd., both of Rochester; David Northrup of 5 Clark St., Mt. Morris; and Douglas Magle of 1645 Scribner Rd., Penfield.

They were among the 10,000 senior students from all over the country who did better than 99 percent of the nation's 470,000 who took the exam. The four will compete for scholarship grants in further examinations.

Students Slate Celebration

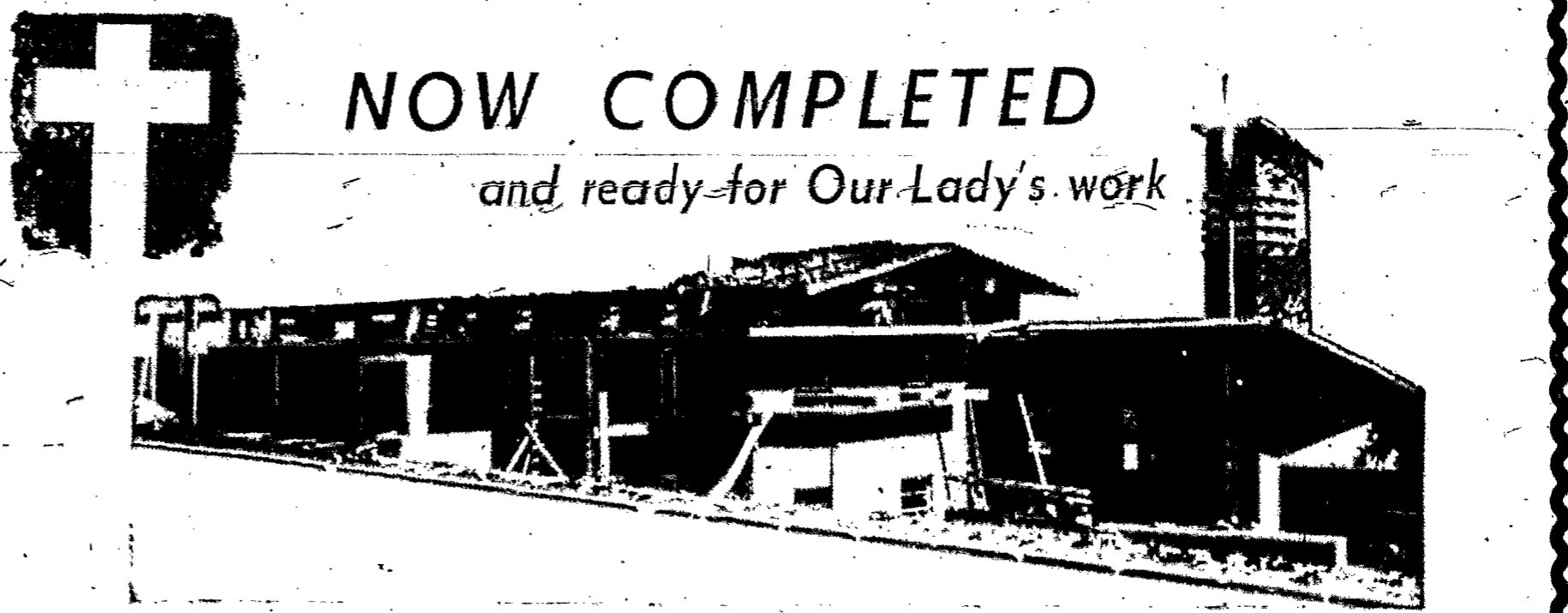
