## Highest In History Diocese Donated \$371,672 To Missions In 1957

Catholics of the Rochester Diocese contributed in 1957 the highest amount ever given here for the Church's worldwide mission program.

The total is an impressive \$371,672.44, as reported today by Rev. George S. Wood, diocesan director of the Society for the Propagation of the Faith.

In 1956, diocesan contributions to the missions totaled \$302,498. Father Wood issued the 1957 Propagation of the Faith report on the eve of the annual "Mission Sunday."

He specifically appealed for a \$2 contribution in the Mission collection this Sunday.

**THE MISSION SUNDAY** collection and other monetary gifts received during the year by the Propagation of the Faith Society are divided three ways, Father Wood explained. He said that 51 percent of each dollar goes to foreign missions, 49 percent to home missions, and 9 percent to aid missions in the Near-East.

Memberships in the Society are received Mission Sunday. The Society has been termed the Pope's "Community Chest" for worldwide mission activities. Members of the Society receive Bishop Fulton J. Sheen's monthly illustrated magazine, *Mission*.

**Report**

Details of the 1957 receipts and expenditures of the Diocesan Office of the Propagation of the Faith are listed by parishes in a special Mission supplement issued with this edition of the Courier-Journal.

The report also includes \$1,331.04 provided through wills and \$59,499.84 in Mass stipends distributed to missionary priests.

Children in the schools raised \$238,883.75 through the Holy Childhood Association. Miscellaneous income amounted to \$12.35.
