'Little Singers' Give Concert

Geneva — The Little Singers of Paris completed a captivated a large audience Thursday in De Sales High School auditorium in a benefit performance for St. Stephen's School.

An impressive sight in their simple white vestments and wooden crosses, the 30-voice choir gave an outstanding 180-part program of religious and popular music.

THEIR REPERTOIRE ranged from the polyphonic church music to the gay folk songs of many nations, sung in the original languages.

The boys between the ages of 11 and 16 were under the direction of Msgr. Fernand Maillet, known as one of the world's finest and most sensitive choral directors.

Exquisite harmonizing in the organ-work and poignant beauty of the solo parts marked the concert program. The enthusiastic applause which greeted the singers was testimony of the audience appreciation.

Their glorious fresh and melodious voices echoed throughout the large hall creating at times the effect of a smooth velvet stream of orchestra, and again the deep majestic notes of an organ. Their music ranges from simple four-part harmony to highly complicated scores with six or more times eight parts.

FIRST GROUP of the Little Singers include 14 French and arranged by Neyou, three religious compositions on an identical liturgical text, "Tenebrae Factae Sunt," which were written by three countries apart. Well known German, Spanish, and Greek selections were also heard. In the second group were selections by Loth. Boller, Bohuslav and Enrico Milkand.

As encore numbers, the group sang, "Ave Maria," and concluded on a patriotic note, "The Star Spangled Banner" and "The Marseilles."
