

Formica Exhibit At Convention

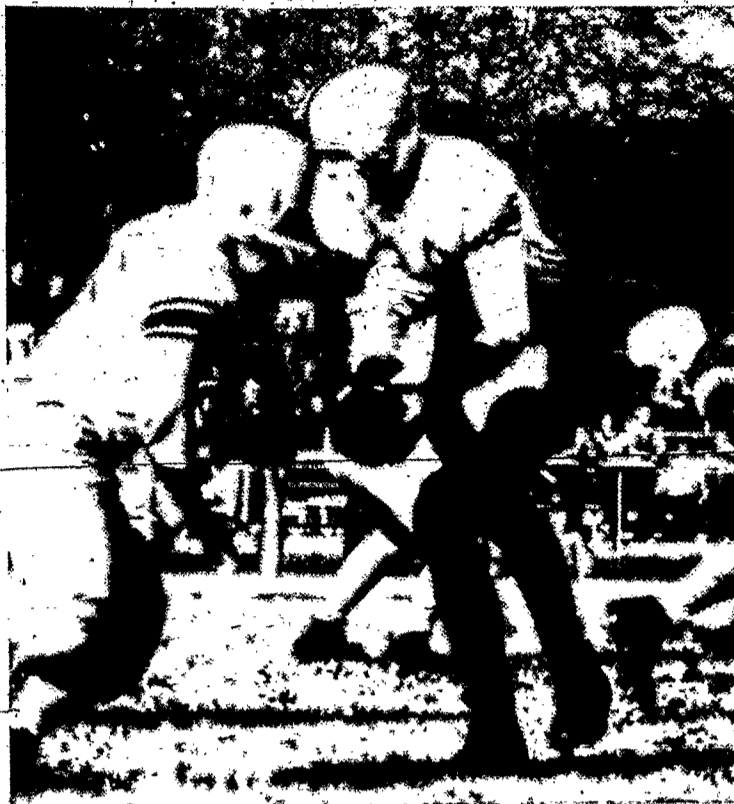

New Orleans Hospice Aids Skid-Row Men

New Orleans—(NC)—A skid row hospice here sheltered, clothed and fed 90,645 homeless men free of charge during 1957.

In citing statistics of the Ozanam Inn, Brother John Hurley, its director, said the inn's record of assistance to homeless men will be surpassed this year.

"In the first eight months of 1958," he stated, "we cared for 72,049 men—an average of 9,000 a month. The remaining four months of 1958 will give us a minimum of 38,000 more men to care for, giving us a total for 1958 of at least 108,049 men."

BROTHER HURLEY is a member of the Brothers of the Good Shepherd, a community founded in Albuquerque, N.M., about eight years ago. The motto of the community is "Charity Unlimited." Its founder, Brother Mathias Barrett, is now the superior.

Four U.S. Laymen Plan Aid To Mexican Poor

Philadelphia—(NC)—Four laymen will depart shortly for Mexico to spend at least two years together in disseminating the social teachings of the Church in a district marked by low economy, inadequate education and other community problems.

THE TEAM consists of a physician, two teachers and one specialist in credit unions.
