BOOK SHELF

 Life of Christ, by the Most Rev. Fulton J. Sheen, McGraw-Hill, '58, 539 pp. \$6.50.

This book takes its place with Goodier's "Public Life of Our Lord Jesus Christ," Guardini's "The Lord," Ottocar Prohaska's "Meditations," in its being, tireless contemplation of the God-Man and powerful focus on the psychology of those He came to save. It is a book to live with.

It differs from complements them in ways, big and little - not least in its last-minute modernity. Our times move fast. This "Life," twenty-five years ago, has yet reckoned in every chapter with a big and wavering today.

The lesser things special to it are the Salvador Dali "Christ of St. John of the Cross" on the jacket that Christ-head seen from above, bathed in the Father's light on a cross poised high over the beautiful, lonely earth; and the 17-page Index to thoughts one wants to remember, as well as to names one surmises doesn't to the distinction between "white" and "black" grace for instance; and the equally effective "reading" that accompanies it. I mean that almost every reader will find these lines as he reads, in a familiar and purposeful voice.

The other told beauty of Scripture lines, sweep across each page (Knox) is often the chosen parable.

THE GREATER reasons for treasuring this "Life" may be quickly expressed and only slowly experienced. This is the deepest, most uncomprehending Bishop Sheen, this writing has a new stature.

This is not pedantic. The time has come when through a dozen paragraphs on through a chapter. When it goes off you're not only pleased, you're caught on a note of good deal closer to Christ, and anxious to keep following.
