From Marx To Christ

"From Karl Marx To Jesus Christ," by Rev. Ignace Lepp. Sheed '58. 212 pp. \$3.75.

Ignace Lepp, after giving ten ardent years of his young married life to Communism, was converted to the Faith by reading Siemkiewicz' "Quo Vadis."

THE EARLY Christians were the realization of his Communist dreams. But were they real? Was it history?

Cincinnati — (NC) — An authority on constitutional law assailed segregation as "the utter fruit of so-called racial supremacy" and called for "loyal obedience" to the decisions of the Supreme Court.

In an address at Xavier University here, Father William J. Kenely, S.J., visiting professor at Loyla University school of law, Chicago, also declared that "the reckless use of insulting epithets and the irresponsible imputation of improper motives" have created a "public fear" of discussing the segregation issue.

"LOYAL OBEDIENCE to the Supreme Court does not preclude honest and reasonable efforts to reverse its decisions by the ordinary process of legal advocacy," he said, "or by the lawful political process of constitutional amendment."

"But it does preclude tongue-in-cheek tactics of evasion and defiance based upon obsolete and unconstitutional theories of interposition and nullification."

"The philosophy of the natural law," said Father Kenely, former dean of Boston College's law school, "provides a rational and spiritual basis for our civil rights and liberties."

"All of us," he continued, "black and white and yellow and red and brown, of all religious creeds and national origins, have been created by the one God for intimate and unsegregated association with Him in perfect happiness for all eternity — a transcendent destiny which reduces to sheer stupidity the pride and prejudice based upon accidental and temporary differences..."

uit theologian, who gave him two and three hours every day for weeks, and moderated his bitterness against Communism! Now he learned social Catholicism from Papal Encyclicals, all the radical ideas of the Church Fathers and of St. Thomas Aquinas, and the essential sharing-of-spiritual-wealth which was the Mystical Body.

Then and not till then did his new friend give him religion, via the saints, St. Francis of Assisi first.

There are other Orders, other names, in the later story, Benedictines, Franciscans, Emmanuel Mounier, Pere Henri de Lubac — and the last word, "Everything still remains to be done," suggests that Ignace Lepp's seven-year years in the priesthood have furnished him with a lively sequel to this story.

But this book, from the last fifty pages of which I have drawn the conversion-story, is an unusual testament, from within the Party, of the growth of Communism, its absorption of two generations of young idealists, its symptoms (I hope) of decline. It explains the Communist thought-process, and how the practice of criminal tyranny can be for so long a time accepted by the sincere believer.
