Wilson Case Closed
Waverly — Several weeks ago the Rev. G. Stauri Hogan wrote to Governor James E. Folsom of Alabama sending a check for \$1.98 to cover the amount stolen by Jimmy Wilson and for which he was sentenced to die in the electric chair.

The following letter was received by Father Hogan from Gov. Folsom: "I am herewith returning the contribution you made in behalf of the Jimmy Wilson case. There is no way that this can be applied to the case itself."

"On September 28th I commuted the sentence of death by electrocution to life imprisonment in the Alabama State Penitentiary." Father Hogan commented in the St. James Apostle, parish publication: "We hardly were naive enough to believe that the check for \$1.98 could be applied to the case. We sent it 1. to show the trifling sum involved; 2. The injustice of a law which would impose the death sentence for the theft of such an insignificant sum; 3. to insure a reply from the Governor, which now has been received together with the assurance that the life of Jimmy Wilson has been spared."
