GOD LOVE YOU!

THE OTHER DAY a priest walked into the National Office of the Society for the Propagation of the Faith. He was ordained about 37 years. We recognized him as one of our classmates. His coat was torn in the back in his pocket was a small thermos bottle and tiny sandwiches wrapped in the little brown bag he carried. He refused an invitation to dinner or to spend the night saying he did not mind being alone, even preferred it since he was so used to it in his small parish.

THIS WAS HIS STORY. When he was ordained, he received to live on \$41.00 a month. Every cent over and above that amount, he set aside, to be given to the Holy Father through his Society for the Propagation of the Faith to aid all the Missions of the Church. All he had saved and all that had been given him as gifts through the years and all that fell to him from begging, poverty and sacrificing, even legitimate needs, he earmarked for the Vicar of Christ.

HE HAD EVEN CRUSHED ALL PERSONAL WISHES as to how the money should be spent. "Give it to the Holy Father; he knows the Missions better than I do." Here was not only a priest, but a victim; not only an offerer of a host and a chalice, but also the offered. One quickly forgot his old clothes and the scanty lunch and remembered only holiness and goodness.

GENUINE SANCTITY IS HIDDEN; even the All-Holy God the "Hidden God." But such priests as this have a peculiar power of inspiration over the rest of us. No one knows better than a priest that he is the representative of the Crucified High Priest and therefore should be sacrificial. Example, not words, draw the truth into the daily practice of our lives. We pray for the lally who have an unmistakable and unimpaired lack of self-interest which priests are saintly and the priests who still want to be saints will follow this example of a priest and his multiplied spiritual through the years.

THOUSANDS AND THOUSANDS of our lally and our clergy could build small chapels in Africa; they cost only a few thousand dollars. Why not send us the name of the chapel you want to build in Mission lands and we will send your sacrifices to the Holy Father who will decide the place.

Best Stamp

Washington, D. C. — (RNS). — This Spanish stamp was chosen by the Collectors of Religion on Stamps Society (COROS) as the best religious postage stamp in 1957. Stamp shows the miraculous appearance of the Sacred Heart of Jesus to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque. It was issued to mark the 100th anniversary of that country's consecration to the Sacred Heart.

Church Gains 13 Million Report Says

Cincinnati—(NC)—The Catholic population of the world increased by almost 13 million persons in the past year, according to an estimate made here.

The 1958 edition of the World Mission Map, published annually by the national center of the Catholic Students' Mission Crusade here, lists the world's Catholic population as being 509,505,000, an increase of 12,993,000 over last year's total.

Although the total Catholic population of the world increased, the map's statistics show that the percentage of Catholics with reference to the total world population decreased from 18.5 to 18.2 per cent.

THE UNITED STATES, with 35,846,477 Catholics, is ranked fourth in the world in the absolute number of Catholics, but many other countries outrank it in the percentage of Catholics in the population.

First in the absolute number of Catholics is Brazil, with 57,660,000; Italy is second, with 48,058,000; and France is third with 36,935,000.

According to the mission map, the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics has 10 million Catholics, comprising five per cent of the total population. Of the Soviet satellites, Poland has the largest number of Catholics—96.1 per cent of the total population. Czechoslovakia is second, with 82.3 per cent, and Hungary is third, with 60.9 per cent.
