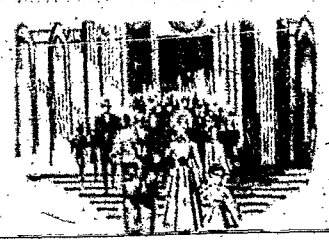


WHAT'S NEW In The Parishes

Passionists Head For Philippines

Rev. Harold Reusch, C.P. of Rochester and Rev. Albino Lesch, C.P. of Auburn, are among seven Passionists leaving for the Philippines. They will join nine Passionist priests who last January pioneered a new mission on the island of Mindanao.

Father Lesch, the first U.S. Air Force chaplain to fly over and bless the North Pole, will depart from San Francisco on Nov. 29 aboard the SS President Wilson. Father Reusch will leave in January.

At the present time, Father Reusch is a professor of canon law at St. Ann's Monastery. The son of the late Martin Reusch and Mrs. Bridget Reusch, now Mrs. William Reusch of that city. He was educated at Corpus Christi school, St. Francis Xavier High School and St. Andrew's Preparatory Seminary in Rochester and Holy Cross Seminary, Dunkirk, N.Y. He was professed Aug. 15, 1947 and ordained Feb. 27, 1953 at St. Michael's Monastery Church, Union City, N.J.

Father Lesch, an Air Force chaplain for 10 years, served in Alaska, the Philippines and Japan. On Jan. 23, 1948, he was on the historic flight that made him the first chaplain to fly over and bless the North Pole. He resigned from the Air Force in 1956.

He is the son of Mrs. Mary Walsh Lesch of Auburn and the late Frank J. Lesch. He attended St. Mary's School, St. Andrew's Seminary, and Holy Cross Seminary, Dunkirk, N.Y.

He was professed Aug. 15, 1934, and ordained May 1, 1941.
