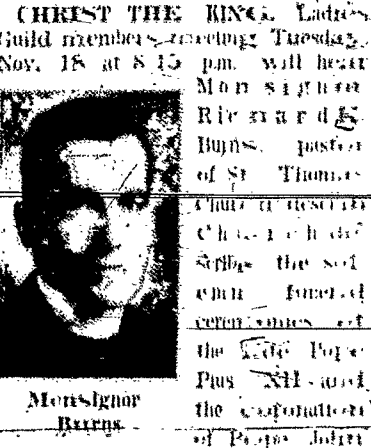


WHAT'S NEW In The Parishes
