## Monsignor Toomey Dies; Syracuse Charities Head

Rt. Rev. Monsignor Joseph B. Toomey, 54, president lect of the Catholic Hospital Association of the United States and Canada and a graduate of St. Bernard's Seminary, Rochester, died suddenly Mon-

day, Nov. 10, in Syracuse.

Msgr. Toomey, director of Catholic Charities for the Diocese of Syracuse, was found dead by an assistant pastor of St. John the Evangelist Church, in the church rectory. Msgr. Toomey was pastor of the Syracuse church.


