

Japanese Ask:

Stop Pacific Nuclear Tests

The Japanese people want the American government to stop nuclear weapons testing in the Pacific, a daughter of St. Paul Nun reported this week.

Before coming to Boston, Sister Mary Vincent viewed the tomb of the Pope.

SISTER JOINED the Daughters of St. Paul in 1939, but was not professed until 1947, since the only novitiate was in Rome, and she couldn't get there due to the war.

She was born in Rochester and here. She received her education and Mother of Sorrows parishes was brought up in St. Carmel in Rochester public schools.

While in Japan, Sister Mary Vincent was stationed at Daughters of St. Paul mission houses in Sendai, Kobe, Tokyo, Osaka and Fukuoka.

She returned to this country last month and is now stationed in Boston, Mass.

SISTER CAME here by way of Italy. She was in Palermo, Italy at the time Pope Pius XII died and attended a solemn Mass for the Pope, celebrated by Cardinal Ruffini.

"The Italian people were really shocked by his death," she said. "Many hundreds of people were turned away at the Cathedral in Palermo who wanted to attend the Mass for the Pope."

United Nations—(RNS)—United Nations approval of measures aimed at expanding aid to millions of homeless refugees and displaced persons in all parts of the world met with high praise from a Roman Catholic priest diplomat here.

Father L. J. C. Beaufort, O.F.M., a Netherlands delegate on the UN Social and Humanitarian Committee, also extolled a resolution adopted by the committee declaring 1959 "World Refugee Year."

Sister said that the Japanese love their homeland very much and will do anything to stop these tests which they consider dangerous to their people.

In the matter of conversions, Sister Mary Vincent said that the Japanese women are much easier to convert than the men.

"THE JAPANESE women have no social standing, so they are much easier to convert due to the increased social position given to them by Christianity."

"The men rebel against us for this reason, as well as because of the nuclear test problem," she added. "It is really difficult to bring them into the Church."

All the Japanese have a great love and affection for the late Holy Father, Pope Pius XII. Sister said. This is due to the help he gave them during World War Two.

"The success that has been achieved by the church in Japan is probably due to his work," she said.

"When the missionaries approach the Japanese to seek their conversion, they say to us 'You call yourselves, Christian, but look what you did and are doing to us.'"

"Naturally, this means that the barrier confronting the missionaries is that much greater to overcome."

Clergy Hit Santa Fe Race Discrimination

Santa Fe—(RNS)—Action of the Santa Fe City Council in tabling legislation against discrimination was criticized here at a meeting of Roman Catholic priests presided over by Archbishop Edwin V. Byrne of Santa Fe.

THE PRIESTS' GROUP termed the Council's move in tabling a resolution from the New Mexico Fair Employment Practices Commission to ban discrimination in public places.

A spokesman for the clergy said they also expressed a desire that the council give serious consideration to the FEPC proposal and the enactment of an anti-discrimination ordinance. "It evades the issue to lay the responsibility on federal or state governments," the spokesman said, noting that the city of Albuquerque has had a workable anti-discrimination ordinance for years.

Explaining the Catholic Church's position on discrimination, he said: "All prejudice and discrimination based on race, creed or color is un-Christian and un-American."

"It is un-Christian because it is directly opposed to the Divine command of brotherly love and to the Christian teaching of the unity of the human race," he said. "It is un-American because it runs counter to the American traditions and to the letter and the spirit of the founding documents of our country, which advocate equality for all citizens."

Dublin, City Of Grace And Mass

Dublin—(RNS)—Dublin was hailed here as a "city in the state of Grace" and a "city of the Mass" by visiting Roman Catholic Bishop John F. Norton of Bathurst, Australia.

The bishop spoke at a ceremony in the City Hall at which he was presented with the Freedom of the City.

He said that Dublin had given the Church Matt Talbot, the saintly workingman, the Pioneer Total Abstinence movement, and the Legion of Mary, a lay apostolic movement that now encircles the world.

Dublin, he added, also was the city of the Mass, because every day men and women of all walks of life flock in multitudes to church to hear Mass and receive Holy Communion.

The Holy See granted permission for increased use of the vernacular language in church rites in north central India.

It was announced here that a new decree affects the regular, daily and Sunday Mass and also the reformed liturgy of Holy Week in this Latin Rite jurisdiction comprising the Archdiocese of Agra and its six suffragan dioceses.

The Holy See said that vernacular translations of the Epistle and Gospel may be read by the celebrant immediately following the normal Latin texts.

In the case of Holy Week, the Holy See granted permission for the use of the local language for all scriptural readings in the liturgy of Holy Thursday, Good Friday and the Easter Vigil.

The metropolitan province of Agra, with a Catholic population of about 53,000 in a total of some 20 million, is one of the least Catholic parts of India. The most widely used vernacular languages are Hindi, Urdu, Bengali, Gujarati and several dialects of Hindustani.
