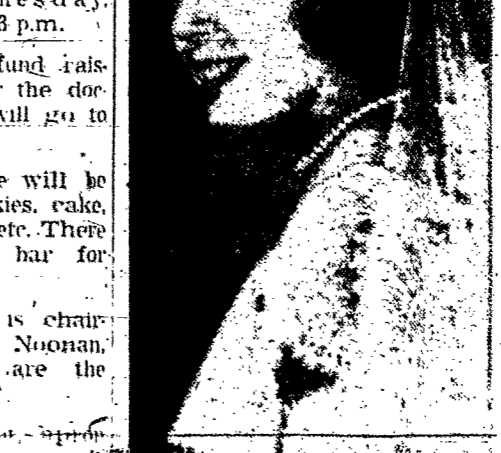
We're Still Foreigners, Us Catholic Americans
